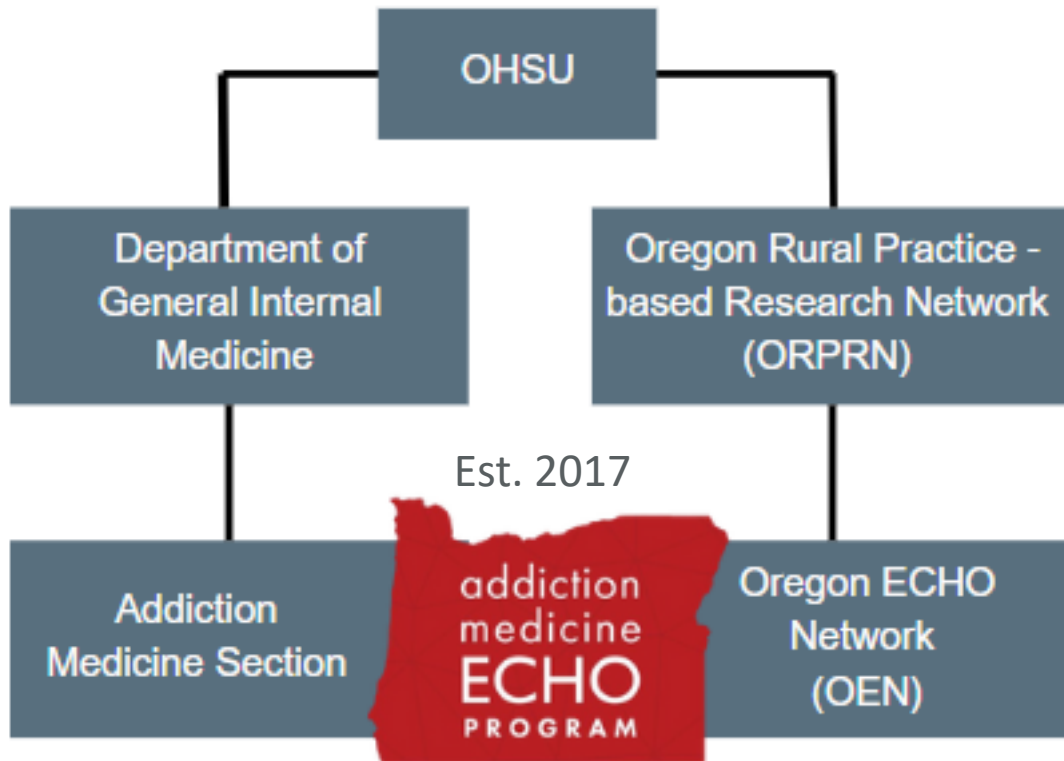

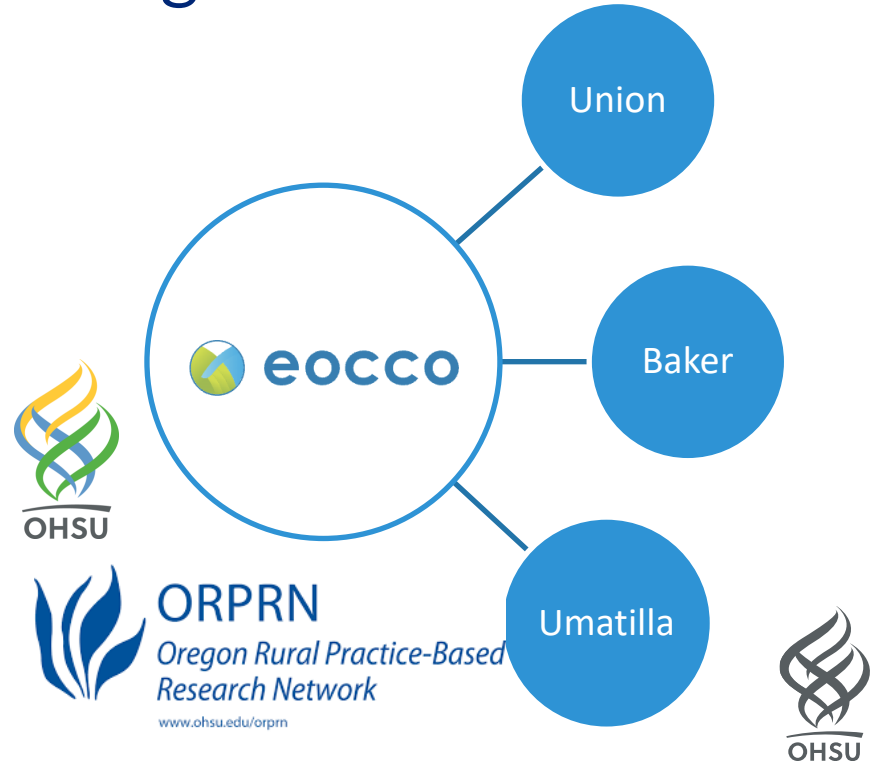
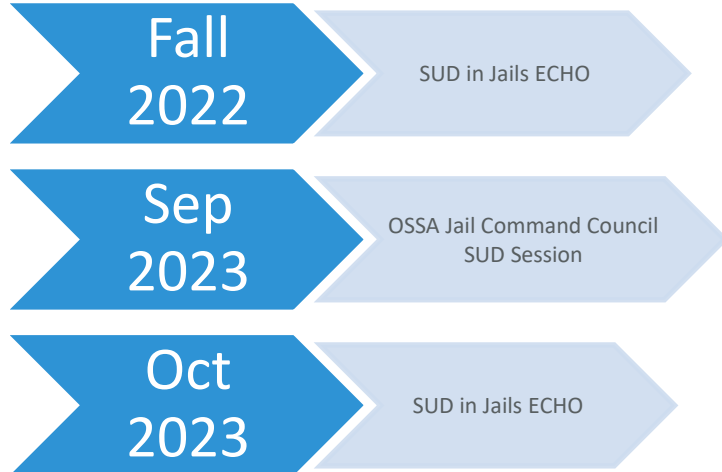

Jail MOUD Program Technical Assistance

The challenges, and solutions

- Jail healthcare at capacity
 - implement high efficiency MOUD programs
 - integrate telehealth and community prescribers
 - assistance for Buprenorphine injectables
- High complexity of delivering buprenorphine (due to fentanyl), and methadone (regulations) in jail contexts
 - Addiction medicine faculty are expert clinicians and educators
- Punitive responses to SUD and diversion of MOUD
 - Education in healthcare model of SUD

Accessible learning collaboratives

- 1 hour Zoom sessions
- Once weekly for 1 quarter
- Short didactic by expert
- Engaging panel conversation and Q&A
- Resource library available

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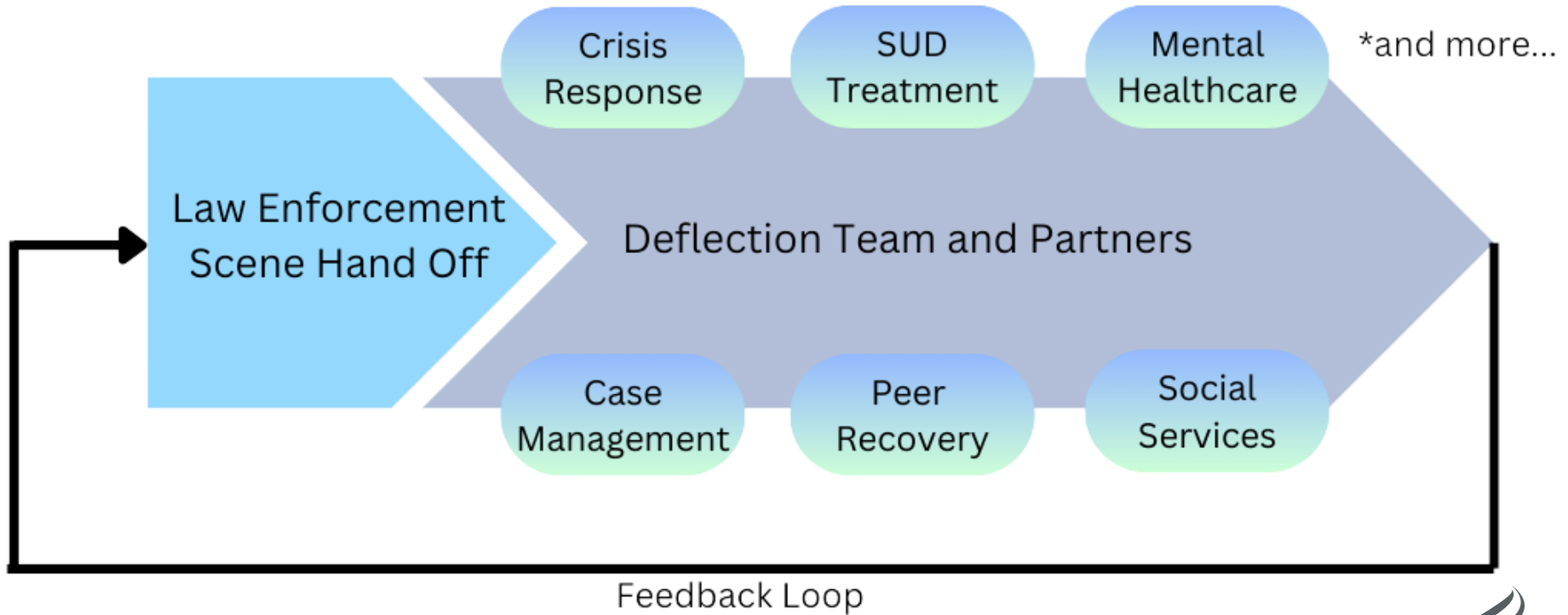
The Need for Implementation TA

- Relationship building for cross-sectoral work
- Mutual agreement on helpful and achievable outcomes
- Translate national best practices to local communities
- Efficient partner referrals across agencies
- Need for continual feedback and quality improvement

OHSU-School of Public Health

OHSU-School of Public Health, in partnership with the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, is working in close collaboration with CJC to establish and implement a statewide data collection system and prepare a deflection best practices report, as laid out in Section 37 (pp 30-31) of HB 4002.

Individualizing Deflection Criteria and Outcome



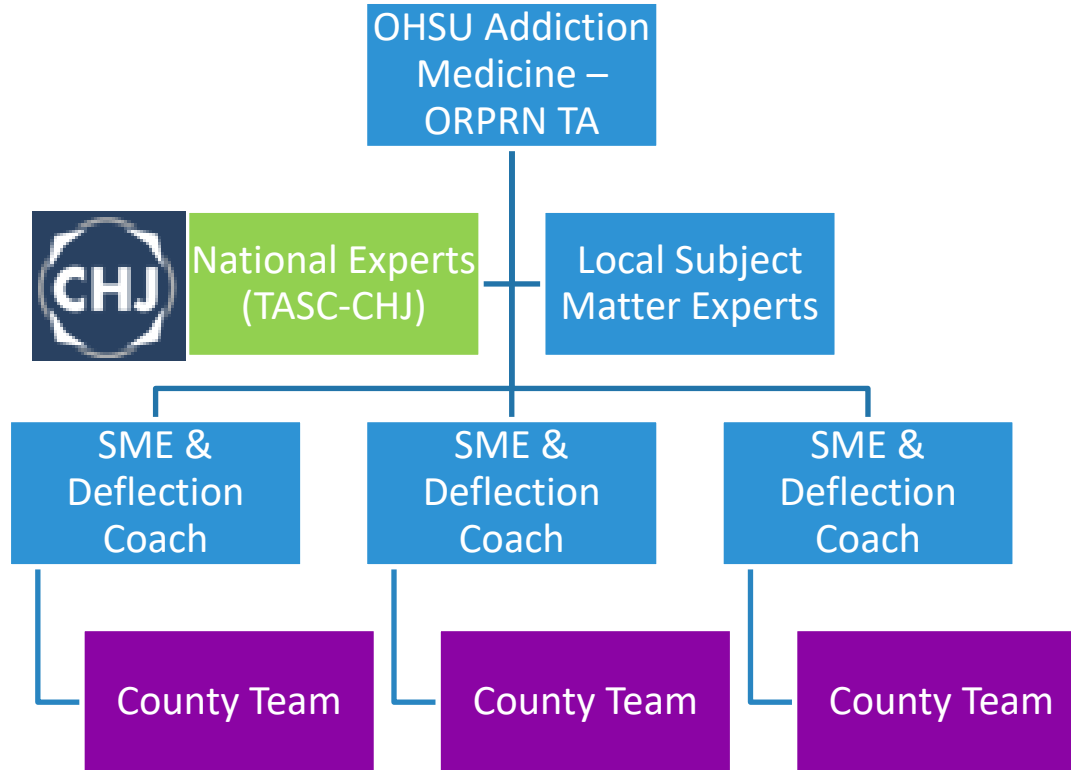
