


## **About FACT Oregon**






### **Top 10 Reasons for Support Requests**

# 45% of All requests are about UNSUPPORTED behavior needs.







# SB 819 and Shortened Day Data

## SB 819 since Sept 2023



Our overall support requests have increased, and SB 819 or Shortened Day are not always specifically called out. We have received requests from families in 43 school districts (up from 20) and 22 counties (up from 14).

# **Top Reasons for Support About SB 819**




General Information/Guidance	58%
School Presenting Single or Limited Options for New Placement	15%
Parent Felt Pressured to Agree to an Abbreviated School Day	7%
Child Having Difficulty in New Placement	6%
Parent/School is Creating Ramp Up Plan for Full Day	5%
School Not in Compliance with 819: Parent Did Not Receive Notification from District	4%
School Not in Compliance with 819: Not Allowing Full Day	3%
School Not in Compliance with 819: Not Having Required Meetings	2%
Parents Want Fewer Meetings	1%

### **SB 819 Requests**


When the support request is about SB 819: **98%** involve unsupported behavior needs.


