HB 4001 Quick Guide

<u>HB 4001</u> became effective on March 27, 2024. The following is an outline of the provisions of the law, including task force membership, timeline and reporting requirements, and scope of study. All materials are on the <u>Task Force OLIS page</u>.

The Specialty Court Task Force members are appointed by leaders in the three branches of Oregon's government and represent certain groups as specified by the law. The Task Force must elect a chair from among the members. The Chief Justice has appointed judicial officers as non-voting members.




