Rationale & Research

- States are struggling with a shortage of quality teachers, particularly for certain positions
- The cost of educator preparation can be prohibitive for some prospective teachers

Teachers and Student Loan Debt

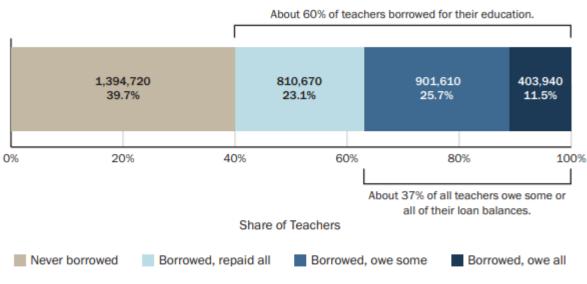


Figure 1: Teachers' Student Loan Borrowing and Repayment Status

Note: Percentages may not sum to 100% due to rounding. Numbers of teachers are rounded to the closest 10. Results are based on full-time, public school teachers who have at least a bachelor's degree.

Colorado



- 16-week residency: up to \$11,000
- 32-week residency: up to \$22,000
- Definition of eligible students



Maryland



Educator Shortage Reduction Act

- Initial Stipend: up to \$3,500
- Internship Stipend: up to \$20,000
- Definition of eligible students

Minnesota



Two Grant programs are available:

Minnesota Student Teachers in Shortage Areas Grant (STSA)

Minnesota Underrepresented Student Teacher Grant (USTG)

Awards up to \$7,500

Pennsylvania



Educator Pipeline Support Grant

- Grant of \$10,000 plus additional \$5,000 for certain schools
- \$2,500 grant to cooperating teacher
- Requires student teachers to teach for at least 3 years

Policy Considerations

- 1) Is the goal to support all educator candidates? Or, to provide targeted support for specific candidates?
- 2) Is the financial incentive sufficient to influence candidate behavior?
- 3) What other factors influence program completion and initial hiring for candidates?
- 4) How will the policy be evaluated?
