# Roundtable Discussion with Lane Area Commission on Transportation, Jurisdictional Leaders, Business Representatives, and Topic Area Experts

#### Topics of Discussion

- Stakeholders invited to share "top of mind" issue for transportation work/package;
- Stakeholders invited to share one item that is a regional challenge;
- Stakeholders invited to share examples of factors that cannot be controlled that affect transportation in their area, and;
- Stakeholders invited to share ideas for diverse, stable and sufficient transportation funding sources.

Major themes that were raised during the roundtable include:

- Safety of roads and streets with existing traffic levels, especially safe routes to schools for students;
- High crash fatalities and a 'zero deaths' initiative for Lane County road;
- Need to explore new funding sources to replace or supplement existing revenue-generating methods;
- Contemplating various revenue sources, including road usage charges, electric vehicle taxes and sales taxes;
- Consistent messaging and education about roads and transportation infrastructure, including current conditions and addressing the public perception of what they spend and what services they get;
- Need for timely maintenance and preservation of existing infrastructure;
- Identify existing revenue sources and regulations that might constrict transportation planning, maintenance, and development;
- Discussion about the size and scope of Lane County related to transportation needs;
- Addressing housing issues and the needs of unsheltered people in the community, and not decoupling housing and housing infrastructure with transportation services and infrastructure;
- Approaching transportation planning with a 'global' approach, such as the Equity Lens toolkit adopted by Lane County;
- Need for reliable infrastructure, especially for commuters;
- Contemplating how to capture revenue from tourists and out-of-state road users;
- Support for public transit;
- Concerns about the environment and transportation related environmental impacts;
- Need reliable access to hospitals, cultural and artistic events;
- Commuter rail development and other railway utilization, and;
- Grants needed for airports and airport infrastructure.
