\$5 million spending proposals

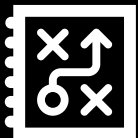
Partner	Stockpile Commodities	Estimated Costs	Link to Needs Assessment
Oregon Health Authority	PPE rotation and current maintenance costs	\$487,000	State partners being able to provide PPE during disasters.
Dept. of Agriculture	Regionally deployable animal sheltering kits	\$175,000	State partners being able to provide regionally relevant supplies.
Dept. of Emergency Management	Regionally staged interoperable communications equipment	\$672,000	Local and state partners having communications capabilities during disasters.
Dept. of Human Services	Resiliency Hub Grant recipients. - Locally stored disaster supplies.	\$3.6 million	Local partners having greater disaster response capabilities by having varied response commodities.
The Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs	Traffic control equipment	\$33,000	Local partners having greater disaster response capabilities to conduct traffic control functions.

 - Opportunity – Strategic program building that addresses the concerns



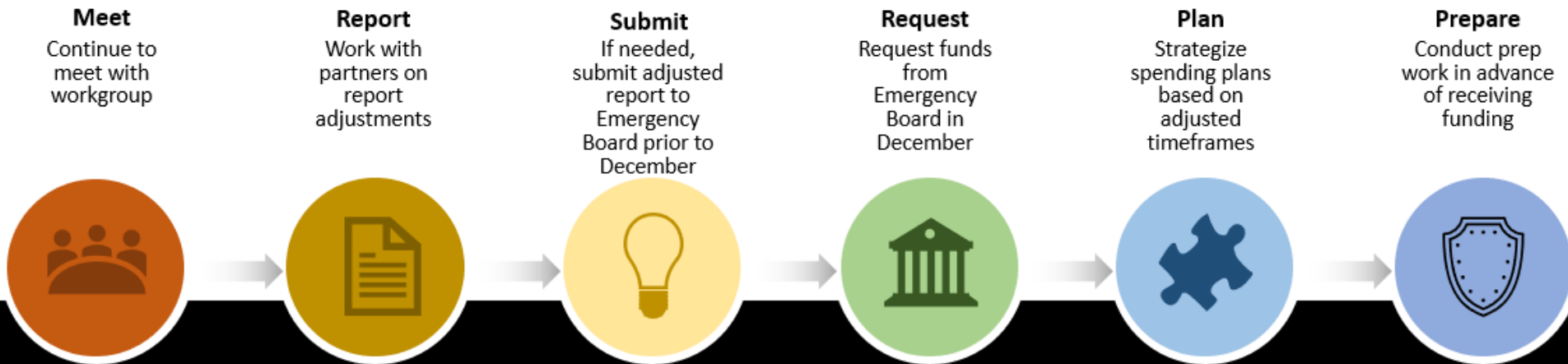
Accepted challenges can lead to great opportunities.
