#### Disaster Preparedness Stockpile

#### \$5 million spending proposals

Partner	Stockpile Commodities	Estimated Costs	Link to Needs Assessment
Oregon Health Authority	PPE rotation and current maintenance costs	\$487,000	State partners being able to provide PPE during disasters.
Dept. of Agriculture	Regionally deployable animal sheltering kits	\$175,000	State partners being able to provide regionally relevant supplies.
Dept. of Emergency Management	Regionally staged interoperable communications equipment	\$672,000	Local and state partners having communications capabilities during disasters.
Dept. of Human Services	Resiliency Hub Grant recipients Locally stored disaster supplies.	\$3.6 million	Local partners having greater disaster response capabilities by having varied response commodities.
The Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs	Traffic control equipment	\$33,000	Local partners having greater disaster response capabilities to conduct traffic control functions.

- 1. Challenge Inventory Management Capabilities
  - Opportunity Development of specific system needs.
- 2. Challenge Timeframes
  - Opportunity Catalyst for program development
- 3. Challenge Local and Tribal Partner Concerns
  - Opportunity Strategic program building that addresses the concerns







#### Disaster Preparedness Stockpile – Next Steps

- OEM will evaluate its Emergency Board ask in October.
- Current plan is to make a stockpile funding request at the December Emergency Board.



 Logistics related to the stockpile plan and developing program will continue to inform the agency's efforts towards the proper crisis management system and bolstering staffing resiliency.
