




- Department of the State Fire Marshal to coordinate urban search and rescue (USAR) function of the state
- Directed the OSFM to study Oregon's needs related to USAR





- USAR task forces
 - Location, extrication, and initial medical stabilization
- After September 11, the OSFM started a program funded by federal grants
- 8 agencies; 2 regions; working toward Type 1 capability
- Program disbanded in 2012 from lack of funding
- Equipment given to participating agencies who intended to keep capability





- Committee formed under the Governor's Fire Service Policy Council
- Members from:
 - Eugene Springfield Fire
 - Portland Fire & Rescue
 - Gresham Fire
 - Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue
 - Hillsboro Fire & Rescue
 - Salem Fire
 - Clackamas Co Fire District #1

- Build four regional type 4 teams
 - Provide training
 - Provide equipment caches
 - Build 1 statewide type 3 team
- OSFM FTE for program management and administration
- Work with DPSST to establish standards










- First biennium: \$6.6 million to establish program
- Second biennium: \$4.3 million to maintain
- Third biennium: \$6.8 million to build Type 3 team
- Possible funding sources include:
 - General Fund
 - Reallocation of State Preparedness & Incident Response Equipment (SPIRE) dollars
 - New revenue through fees or taxes
