

Summer Programs



- Bethel Summer Reading Program
 - o Initially funded from Early Literacy Grant (smaller scale)
 - o Planning began last October
 - o K-3: 4 hours/4 days a week for 7 weeks
 - Structured Literacy Design with Thematic Units

High School Engagement & Credit Recovery

- Initially funded out of remaining ESSER (smaller scale)
- Core Content Credit Recovery Courses, BSU DC Trip, Oregon College Tour, CTE Hub, Athletics Training, Kalapuya Summer Farm Camp
- O High levels of student interest, engagement, and success!
 - Significant impact to on-time graduation and 9th grade on-track!
- Served 390 students and awarded 177.5 high school credits



Summer Reading Program



K-3 Students who were developing readers

- o 362 students regularly attended
- African American 1.1% American Indian/Alaskan Native 0.3% Asian 0.6%
 Hispanic or Latino 35.9% Two or More Races 11.9% White 50.3%
- O Demographic Sub Populations: 32.6% SpEd, 14.1% ELL
- Target Students: Intensive Support/DIBELS Winter Screener

Staff

- Licensed Staff (26), Classified Staff (50), Literacy Coach (1), Behavioral Specialist (1), Administrator (1)
- Training and Preparation
 - On-site coaching and constant collaboration
 - 16+ hours of training and professional development for staff


