13.8% are veterans of color


9.8% of veterans are women

# **OF OREGON DEPT OF CORRECTIONS (ODOC)**

### **Incarcerated Veterans Program**

- Established Incarcerated Veterans Program in August 2016 to assist incarcerated veterans transitioning into Oregon Department of Corrections (ODOC) custody and then as they transition back to their communities.
- ODVA Coordinators assist veterans in custody with reducing, discontinuing, or apportioning monthly VA payments so that veterans are not overpaid while incarcerated.
- ODVA Coordinators have assisted ODOC in establishing a formal Veterans Benefit Specialist program in which a trained incarcerated veteran assists other veterans in learning about veterans' benefits.
- This work is done through outstanding partnership with ODOC.





Oregon ranks in the top five states with highest percentage of veterans experiencing unsheltered homelessness.

In 2023, veterans made up 7.82% of Oregon's homeless population.

Estimated 1,460 homeless Oregon veterans on any given night.



## **Veteran Deaths by Suicides as of 2021**

- Approximately 18 million U.S. Armed Forces veterans in 2024
- National veteran deaths by suicide: 6,329
- Oregon veteran deaths by suicide: 139 (Total Oregon Suicides: 872)
  - 18-34: **16**
  - 35-54: 38
  - 55-74: 56
  - 75+: 29
- Oregon veteran deaths by suicides by firearms: 71.2%
- Oregon deaths by suicides by female veterans: 10%
