Brief Overview Former Process and Need for Change

Increased NOFA Complexity:

- 13+ NOFAs released in 2022, compared to only 2 in 2016.
- Varied timelines and evaluation standards created inconsistency and burden.

Bottlenecks and Delays:

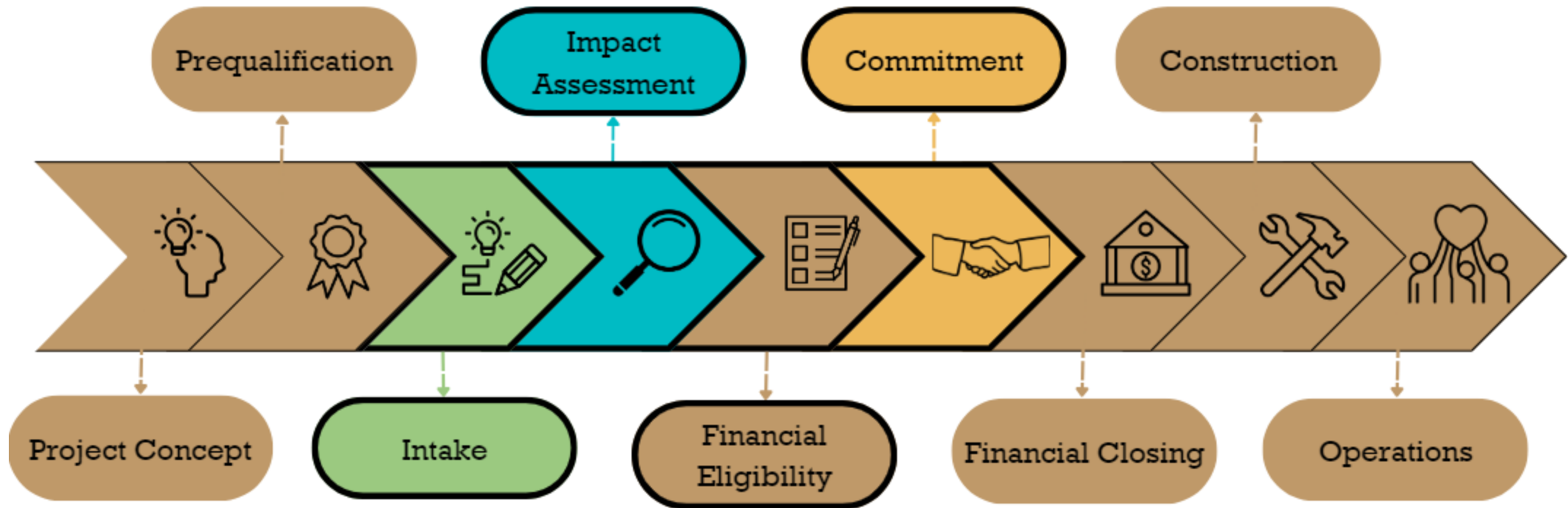
- Slow processing, overlapping deadlines, and limited feedback cycles delayed projects and frustrated partners.

Stakeholder-Driven Redesign:

- Extensive outreach and feedback informed our new, more streamlined process, ORCA.

Overview of New Systems

- Single application across multiple funding streams.
- Real-time tracking and automation through integrated software.
- Assembly-line like process
- Scalable to meet future growth.

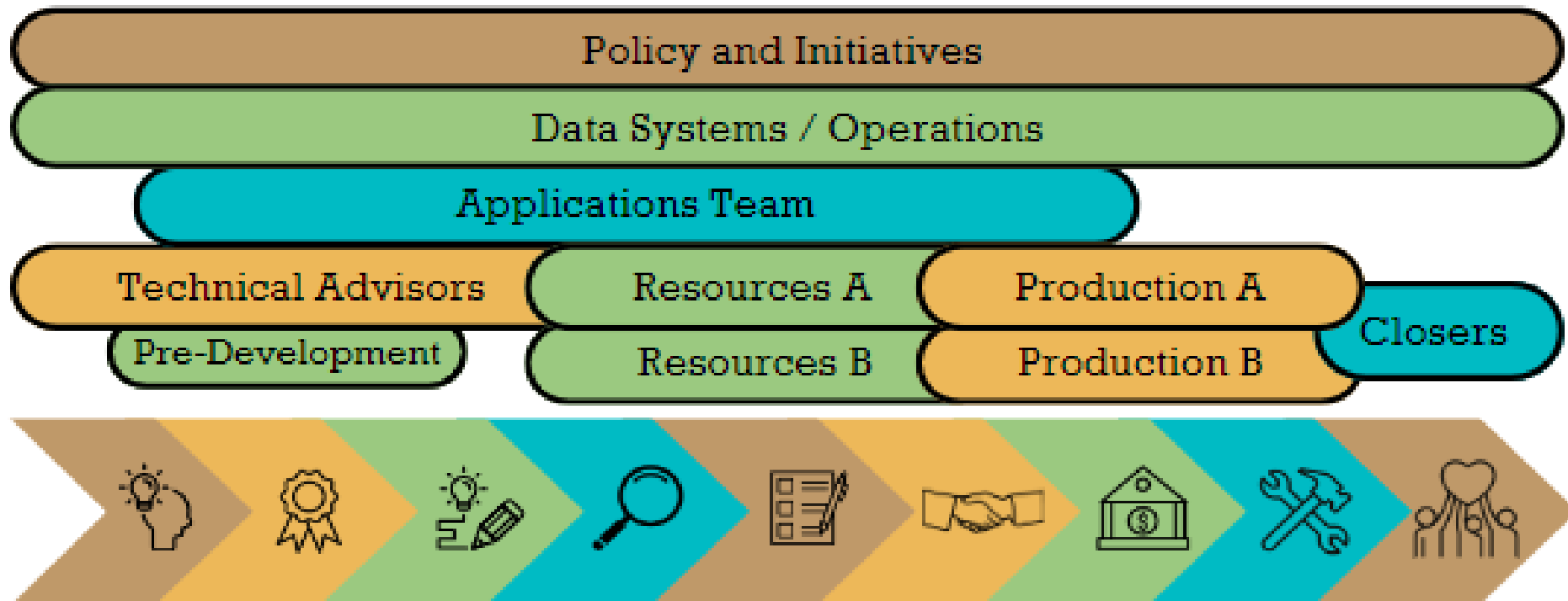
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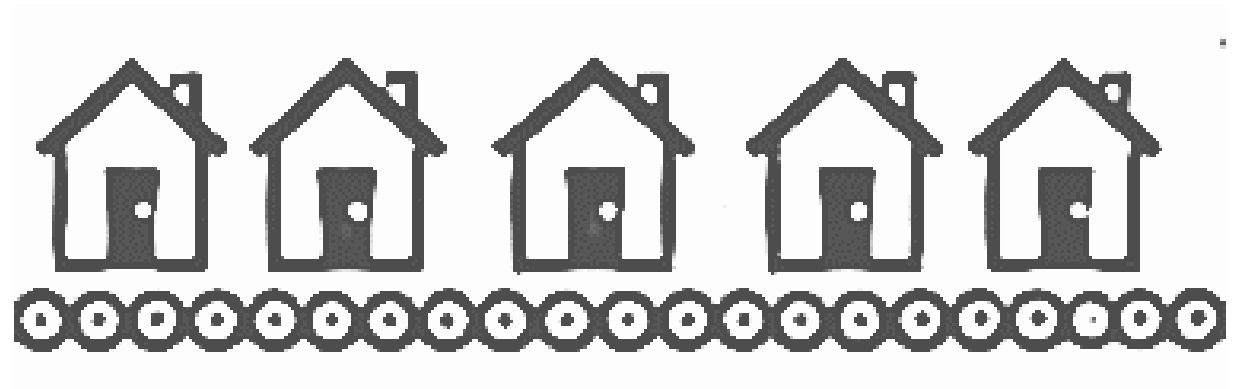
New Division Structure

- Teams now specialize in different stages of the process.
- Easier staff replacement due to specialized roles.
- Higher consistency and faster processing.



Rollout of the Launch

- Tiered rollout to avoid overwhelming staff and the system.
- Managed workload and stretched pipeline.
- Real-time refinement and feedback loop.
 - Late Summer 2023: Gathered partner and stakeholder feedback.
 - Fall 2023: Reorganized teams.
 - Winter 2023 - Launch: Designed and developed the new ORCA system.
 - March 18: Released new Intake form.
 - April 28 Provided system training: Beta testing early access.
 - May 30: Launched ORCA Manual.
 - June 6: Provided system training.
 - June 12: Broad system launch.



Early Numbers

- Intake Form Submissions - 201
 - 71 For-profit, 102 Nonprofit, 27 Housing Authority, 1 Tribe
- 71 - Projects are actively working toward application submission
- 35 - Applications Submitted
- Projects taken to Housing Stability Council for Motion - 6
 - \$114,825,263
 - 473 new units
 - Salem, Corvallis, North Plains, Bend, Lincoln City, Portland, Corvallis
- 290 questions submitted and answered through the new ORCA questions portal

Continuous Improvement

- Learning from past mistakes to refine the process.
- Future-proofing ORCA for scalability and long-term use.

Available Resources and Set-asides

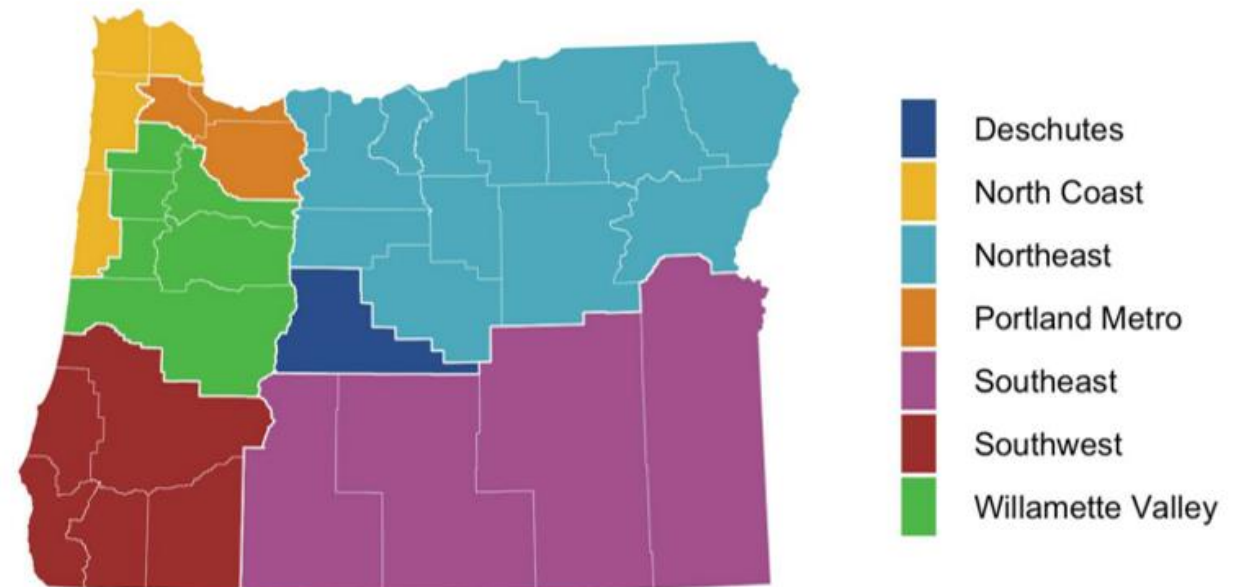
25% of total funding available is set-aside for the following organizations for 2024-25:

- Culturally specific organizations
- Nonprofit development in rural communities

75% of total funding available will be distributed by

Geographic set-asides:

- Eastern (Deschutes, Northeast, Southeast): 15%
\$60 million
- Metro (Portland metro area): 40%
\$160 million
- Western (North Coast, Southwest, Willamette Valley): 45%
\$180 million
