A nondisabling claim occurs when the worker only requires medical services, meaning t temporary disability and they do not have a reasonable expectation of permanent impairment.

Workers' compensation insurers have 60 days to determine whether to accept or deny a claim. Insurers have acceptance or denial of a claim to report the claim information to WCD. This results in a lag time in reported

Workers have 60 days to appeal denied claims to the Oregon Workers' Compensation Board. If the denial is a be changed to accepted status.
