I am writing to express my strong support for increased funding for public transportation and sustainable infrastructure, rather than further investments in freeway expansions and car-centric projects. As a resident of inner-NE Portland, I rely entirely on public transit and cycling to navigate the city, and I am deeply concerned about the long-term impacts of prioritizing freeways over alternative transportation solutions.

My neighborhood is bordered by two major freeways, I-5 and I-84. While these roads serve as key thoroughfares, they also bring significant challenges. The constant flow of high-speed vehicles near my home contributes to elevated levels of air pollution, noise pollution, and a diminished quality of life for local residents. More concerning, these freeways funnel speeding traffic into our streets, creating dangerous conditions for pedestrians and cyclists like myself.

I frequently combine cycling with transit, and this multimodal approach allows me to move around the city easily without contributing to traffic or pollution.

As you deliberate on upcoming transportation budgets, I urge you to prioritize funding for public transit over freeway/road expansions. Let's create a future where Portland continues to lead in sustainability and urban innovation.
