It seems as though every session there is a new and continued push for monies to support those with substance use and mental health issues, and to invest significant resources into housing.

Yet when we look at our treatment court participants, we are scrambling to find beds, sober housing, and more permanent housing solutions. As the new deflection laws and policies are being put into place, competition for these resources is getting more fierce.

This feels in some ways like both the most practical and the most impossible proposal I'm making, but if we could all coordinate what we are doing in a more efficient way we could be so much better at helping our participants stabilize and change their trajectories.
