COMMISSION ON BLACK AFFAIRS

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Commission on Black Affairs subject to Senate confirmation.¹

Statutory Requirements³

The commission comprises 11 Oregon residents to ensure the representation of Black persons, which includes:⁴

- nine members appointed by the Governor representing all geographical areas of the state (ASEMOTA, DOGO, DRURY, DUKE, DUNCAN, FOUTHER-BRANCH, HARDEN-MOORE, RANKIN, WILLIAMS);
- one senator appointed by the President of the Senate (WOODS); and
- one representative appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives (NELSON).

Gubernatorial appointees serve four-year terms; legislators serve two-year terms. The commission elects its chair and vice chair. A majority of members constitutes a quorum. Non-legislative members may receive per diem.

Duties⁵

The commission was created to work for the implementation and establishment of economic, social, legal, and political equality for Black persons in Oregon. Its duties include:

- monitoring existing programs and legislation designed to meet the needs of Oregon's Black population;
- identifying and researching problem areas and issues affecting the Black community and recommending actions to the Governor and Legislative Assembly, including recommendations on legislative programs;
- maintaining a liaison between the Black community and government entities;
- encouraging Black representation on state boards and commissions; and
- meeting at least annually in a joint meeting with other commissions to consider and act upon issues of mutual importance.
