The recommendations presented during the meeting had been revised based on prior member input:

- To recommend that the Legislative Assembly provide direction and resources to the agencies to explore medical respite, CCO and D-SNP opportunities, and to study the regulatory framework for long-term care facilities.
- To include ODHS in the recommendation related to medical respite.
- To add context to the recommendation to increase rates for adult foster homes.
- To remove OSBN from workforce concepts.
