


Organizational Structure

ORNG Fire Season



265 Service Members Supported Wildland Firefighting Operations

- 207 Service Members on State Active Duty
 - Hand Crews, MEDEVAC, Bucket Missions
 - 2 MEDEVAC Missions
 - 227,840 Gallons of water dropped
- 63 Service members funded through Federal Funds (VHUR)
 - Facilitated Fire response
 - 37 Air members funded by ANG funds for Red Card Training
 - 1 Air LNO funded by ANG VHUR funds
 - 10 funded by ARNG VHUR funds

Additional Support

\$51K in Air VHUR funds provided for fire boots and training costs

Oregon's 2024 fire season burned <u>1.9 million acres</u>; Largest fire season on record.







CST/ Counter Drug/ CERFP/ SPP








OMD State Structure







OMD: Governor's Recommended Budget



- Funding for a Re-enlistment Bonus program (our #1 priority)
- Increased funding to address Deferred Maintenance in our armories
- Increased positions for the Oregon Youth Challenge Program
- Permanent Positions for the Security Program at Kingsley Field
- Expenditure Limitation for Cooperative Agreement 1031 at Kingsley Field and Portland Air National Guard Base
- Authorization for the State to sell Bonds for the following projects:
 - \circ Linn County Readiness Center
 - $\,\circ\,$ Klamath Falls Micro-Armory
 - Salem Armory & Auditorium ASLEP/REEP
 - OYCP Athletic Field
 - Woodburn Armory ASLEP
 - Bend Armory ASLEP
- New Debt Service to allow for early session bond sales for some of our projects
