# Emergency and Restricted Teaching Licenses



### **Commonalities**

### **Both Licenses**

District has no other applicants

Community Members willing to teach

District agrees to provide supervision and support

Show progress to be issued over multiple years

District Sponsorship required

TSPC's new data system intends to capture these reasons in the words of the districts making the requests


#### **Differences**

<b>Emergency Licenses</b>	Restricted Licenses
No bachelor's degree	Bachelor's degree is earned
May or may not be in a program	Enrolled in or intend to enroll in a preparation program
Could be a one-time position	May be issued for one- or two-year terms at the discretion of the district
Issued for one year at a time	Maximum of four years on the license



## **Sponsored Substitutes**



- Data excludes full "Substitute" licenses
- Other license types are eligible to sub employment data not reported or captured
- Emergency Substitute series of temporary rules 2021-2023
- District Substitute permanent rule effective 2023
- 2024-2025 school year data through 11/30/2024



## Waivers of Licensure Requirements



OAR 584-200-0100 Waiver of Licensure Requirements by the Commission

(1) The Executive Director may waive, in part or in whole, the requirements for teaching, administrative and personnel service licenses if the applicant provides evidence of academic skills, experience and knowledge demonstrating mastery of the Commission-adopted standards for the license.

#### **Process**

- Submit an application and fee
   Waiver process initiated one of two ways:
  - Request from the applicant; or
  - Staff determines requirements not met and forwards to management for further review
- Director of Licensure prepares for review by Executive Director
- Executive Director reviews
- If approved, license is issued and waiver is reported to the Commission
- If not approved, the applicant may submit additional documentation or the application is closed

### Licensure Waivers – The Data



In the overall picture of licenses issued, very few (0.46%) of licenses are granted based on a waiver.

Total licenses issued

2022 = 29,167

2023 = 28,979

Total = 58,146

Total waivers granted (same time period) = 270

Ways to show content knowledge other than testing
Many states adopting some kind of alternative assessment

## **Commonly Waived Requirements**



### **Content Testing Waivers for those prepared outside of Oregon**

- Applicants with five years of teaching experience in their respective content area(s)
- Applicants who are struggling with the content testing (e.g., test anxiety):
- Multiple Measures Assessment (MMA) can be completed by TSPC staff.

### **Professional Administrator License Program Completion**

- o Ph.D or Ed.D in Educational Leadership and experience in leadership roles
- States not requiring a license to serve as a superintendent

### **Professional School Counselor License Advanced Programs:** To move to the Professional School Counselor license:

- Advanced Degree (Education Specialist or doctorate)
- National certification (National Board for Certified Counselors or National Board for Professional Teaching Standards) or
- Other advanced degrees, coursework or assessments as approved by the Executive Director (reported as a waiver to the Commission)

### Reciprocal Teaching License: When the license from another state is expired

- Consider how long has it been expired
- Have they been offered employment in Oregon?
- Any background check considerations?
