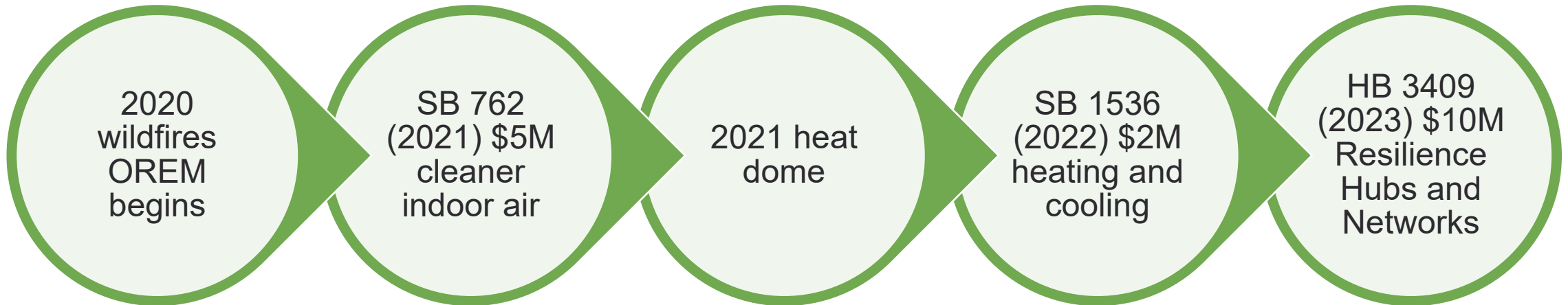

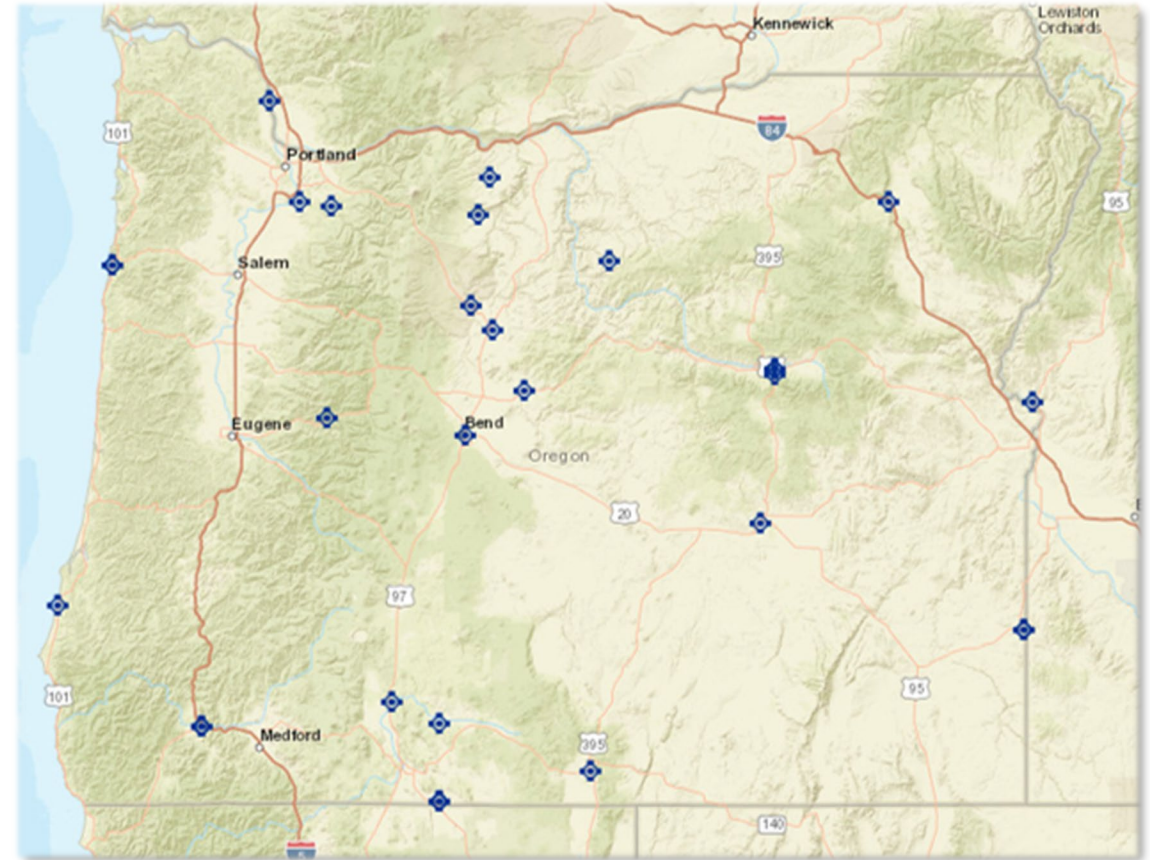


OREM warming/cooling/cleaner indoor air grant

Klamath County School District Bonanza School Gymnasium, \$150,000 grant

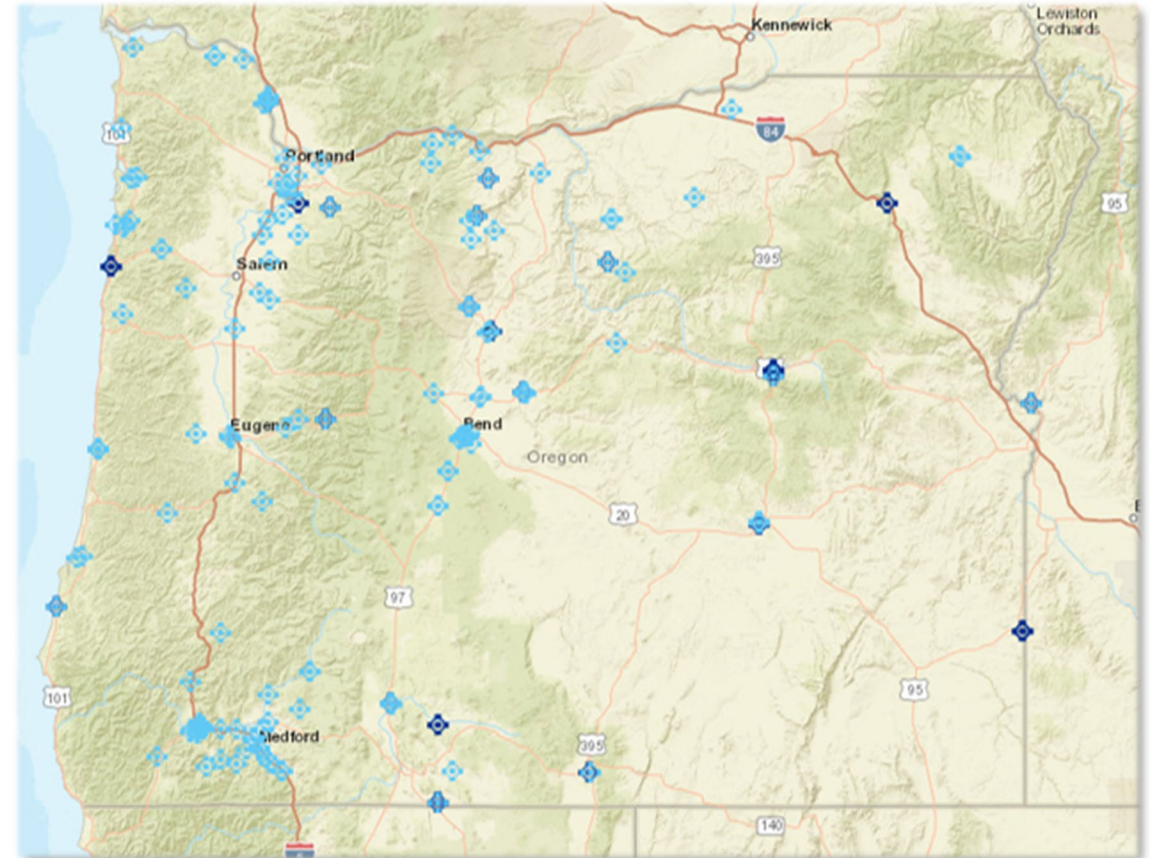


OREM air scrubbers

Air scrubbers and climate trailers purchased using funds from SB 1536 staged with community partners



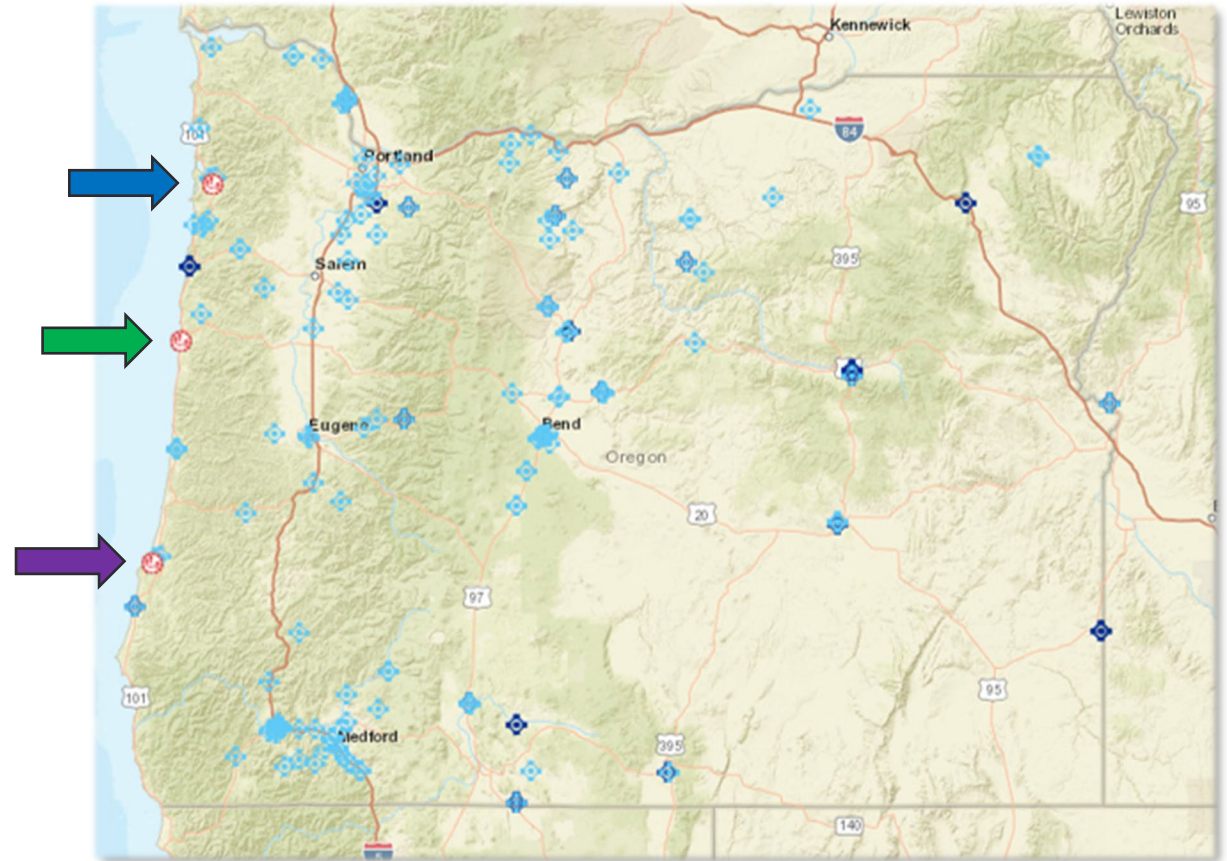
- 284 scrubbers stage in the community

Resilience Hubs and Networks Grant project locations

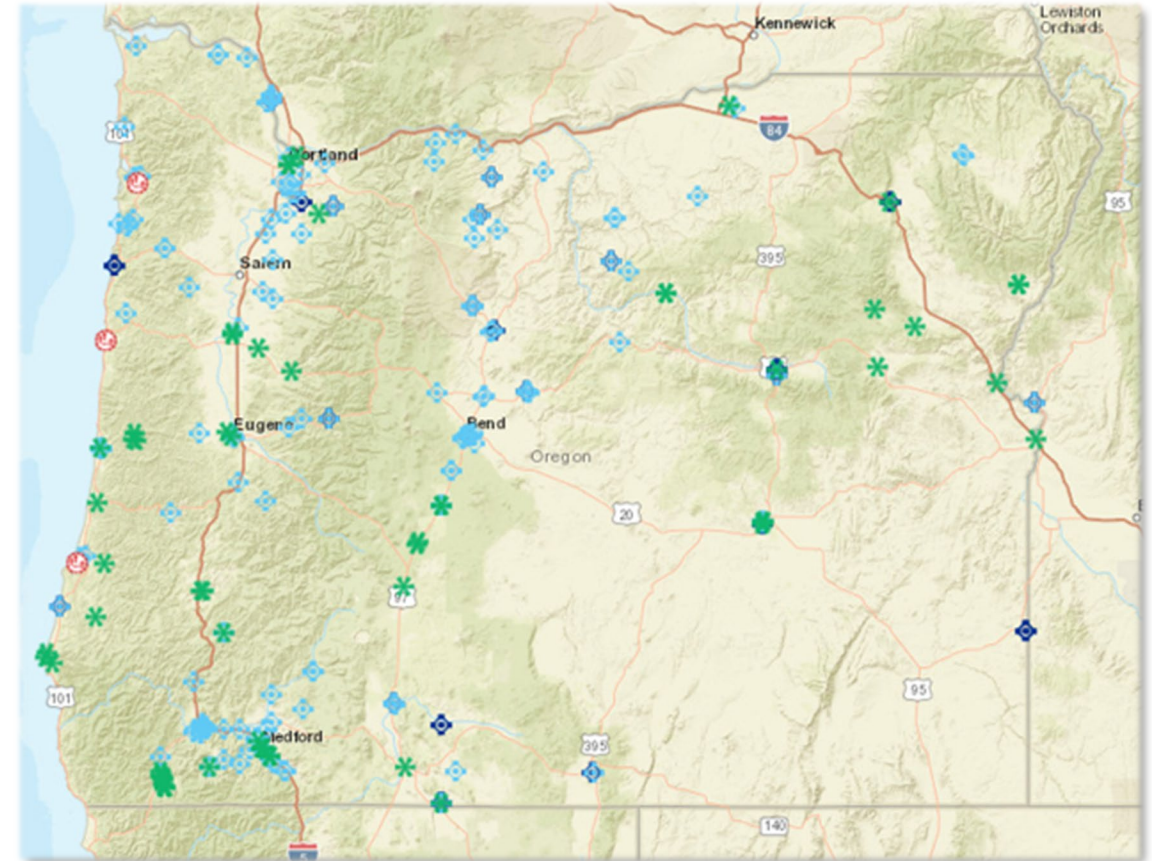

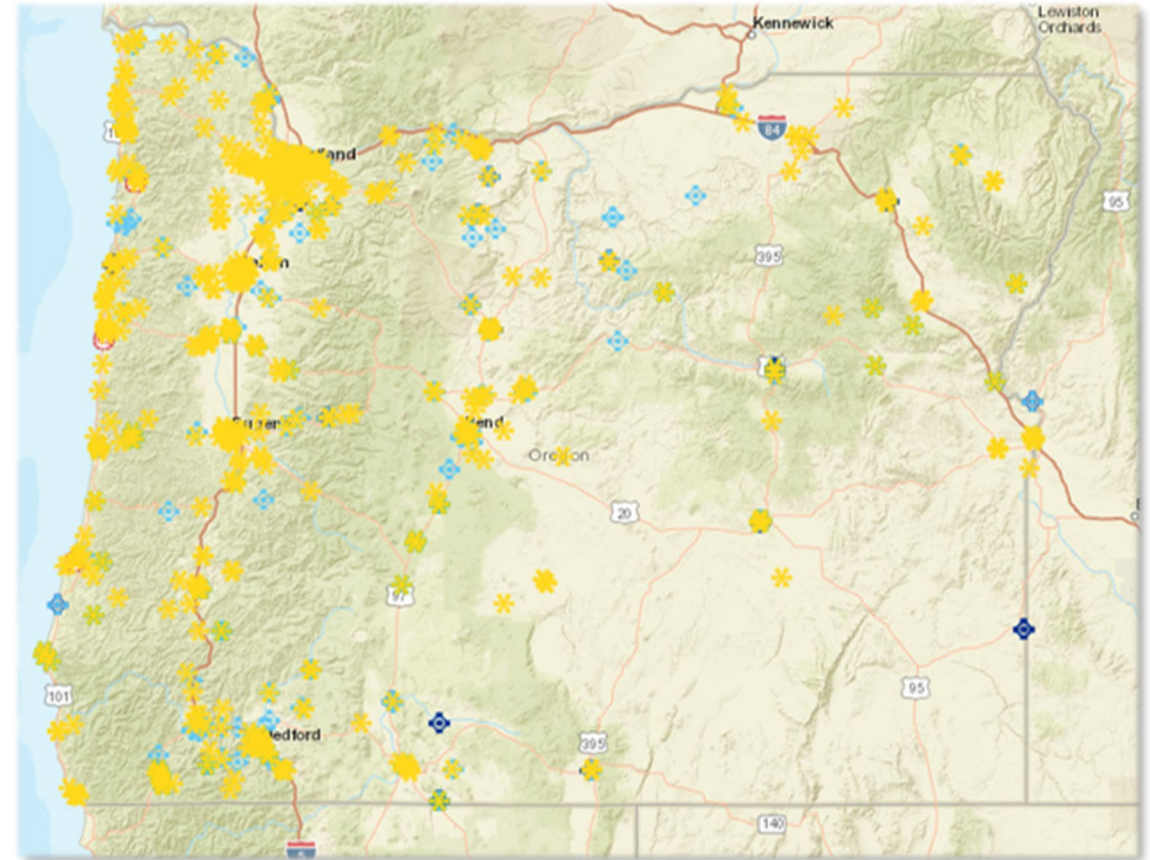
