Critical Incident Review Team (CIRT) Overview

#### What is the CIRT and CIRT review?

A Critical Incident Review Team (CIRT) is a designated committee assigned by the ODHS Director after a fatality of a child.

Most CIRT reviews do not involve children in ODHS custody.

#### Purpose of a CIRT review:

- Ensure safety of other children in the household.
- Increase accountability to the public.
- Identify ODHS and law enforcement agency actions taken or not taken in response to the critical incident or to the events that led to the critical incident.
- Ensure ODHS timely response of recommendations.
- Increase ODHS's ability to address and recommend necessary changes to Child Welfare systems.




## CIRTS identify gaps in service quality

#### **CIRT recommendation examples:**

- Ensuring proper tools for quality clinical supervision.
- Support for evidence-based and promising practices.
- Investment in train the trainer for Safe and Together Model to improve practice when domestic violence is present.
- Safe Systems Mapping to explore youth substance use.
- Child Welfare Health and Wellness program to develop guidance for caseworkers when assessing a child with a notable medical diagnosis.

#### Required by Law

ODHS Director, Child Welfare Director, Communications representative

#### By Invite

Central office leadership, subject matter experts, Department of Justice, district/local leadership, community partners, OHA, Self-Sufficiency Programs, district attorney, law enforcement agencies


### What qualifies as a critical incident?

- An incident that resulted in the death of a child.
- Death is reasonably believed to be the result of abuse or neglect.
- Meets at least one of four additional criteria (within the 12 months preceding the death):
  - The child was in the custody of ODHS;
  - The child, sibling or other child living in household was the subject of a CPS assessment;
  - The child, sibling or other child living in household had a pending child welfare or adoption case or
  - The child, sibling or other child living in the household was subject of a report of abuse/neglect, whether or not report was closed at screening without investigation.

## **CIRT Timeline and reporting**


CIRT timelines and reporting are required by statute.
