2	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of
3	Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly of the State
5	of Oregon, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas in 1975, Congress enacted the Education for All Handicapped
7	Children Act (EHA) to ensure that students with a disability are provided
8	with a free appropriate public education that is tailored to their individual
9	needs; and
10	Whereas in 1990, EHA was reauthorized and renamed the Individuals with
11	Disabilities Education Act (IDEA); and
12	Whereas the goal of IDEA is to provide students with disabilities the
13	same opportunity for education as those students who do not have a disa-
14	bility; and
15	Whereas under IDEA, the federal government committed to pay 40 percent
16	of the average per pupil expenditure for special education; and
17	Whereas Congress has fallen short of the IDEA funding commitment ev-
18	ery year since 1975; and
19	Whereas recent federal budgets have funded IDEA at approximately 13

2	funding shortfall in the 2021-2022 school year nationwide was approximately
3	\$24 billion; and
4	Whereas IDEA was a historic step forward, but since its passage Congress
5	has failed to provide the funding it promised; now, therefore,
6	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
7	That we, the members of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly, respect-
8	fully urge the Congress of the United States to fulfill its commitment to fully
9	fund the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act; and be it further
10	Resolved, That a copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of
11	the United States, the Senate Majority Leader, the Speaker of the House of
