

DIVERSE OREGON VETERAN LANDSCAPE

Estimated **266,690** veterans in Oregon having served across 5 major war eras

75% served during a wartime era

More than 50% of veterans are age 65 and older _____

13.8% are veterans of color

9.8% of veterans are women

COUNTY AND TRIBAL VETERAN SERVICE OFFICERS

- Access to earned benefits is the core of ODVA's advocacy efforts.
- VSOs in all 36 counties and 4 Tribal lands receive pass-trough funds administered by ODVA

CLAIMS AND APPEALS FY24 OUTCOMES

- Conducted 226 federal VA appeals on behalf of veterans and their families.
- Retroactive awards for individuals represented by ODVA exceeded \$53 million.
- 9,491 new veteran claimants represented by ODVA's Powers of Attorney

AGING VETERANS OUTREACH FY24 OUTCOMES

- \$256,266 in retroactive benefits payments
- \$29,490 in new monthly benefits to veterans
- \$629,145 in privately paid nursing home expenses returned to veterans
- 85 ODVA veteran volunteers volunteered a total of 982 hours providing outreach to more than 4,400 aging veterans and their families


SPECIAL ADVOCACY for HOUSELESS VETERANS



HOUSELESS VETERAN OUTREACH FY24 OUTCOMES

- Assisted 75 houseless veterans
- Made 25 medical and behavioral health referrals
- Assisted 5 veterans in obtaining ODVA's Veteran Emergency Financial Assistance Grant that helped support stable housing.
- Conducted 15 partner trainings, attended 38 partner network events and 15 stand downs and outreach

SPECIAL ADVOCACY for INCARCERATED VETERANS



INCARCERATED VETERAN PROGRAM FY24 OUTCOMES

- Program Coordinators were able to make over 990 contacts with incarcerated veterans in FY 24
- Contacted 400 veterans during group meetings in prisons across the state
- Assisted in filing 162 veteran claims

LGBTQ+ VETERAN PROGRAM FY24 OUTCOMES

- Assisted 13 veterans to upgrade discharge statuses that were ۰ related to LGBTQ+ identity
- Managed 82 cases, filed disability claims for 48 LGBTQ+ veterans, ٠ housed 4 veterans, updated military records of 5 transgender veterans
- Outreach and engagement at 59 Pride events ٠

WOMEN VETERAN PROGRAM FY24 OUTCOMES

- Engaged 422 new women veterans
- Provided casework for 51 women veterans
- Biennial Women Veteran Conference

SPECIAL ADVOCACY for TRIBAL VETERANS



TRIBAL VETERAN PROGRAM FY24 OUTCOMES Tribal Veterans Coordinator, hired in April

- Tribal Veterans Coordinator, hired in April 2024, has connected with each of Oregon's nine federally recognized
- Supports Federal VA's Office of General Counsel with accreditation of Oregon's tribal veterans
- Hosts annual Tribal Veteran Advocate Conference
