Oregon Tribal Student Grant (OTSG)

Provides funding for eligible Oregon tribal students to offset the average cost of attendance at Oregon colleges and universities.

Oregon Tribal Student Grant is a last-dollar grant to federal and state grants. Award can be used at any eligible Oregon public university, Oregon community college, and eligible Oregon-based private non-profit institution. Students must apply each year.



GOAL:

To increase college enrollment, completion, and affordability for students from the nine federally recognized tribes in Oregon.



Award Calculation

The Oregon Tribal Student Grant is a last dollar grant to state aid, federal aid, and scholarships to help cover the cost of attendance. Award amounts vary depending on the institution the student attends and if the student has other grants and scholarships. The grant cannot exceed the student's actual cost of attendance.

 Award will be calculated based on the school's average cost of attendance for 15 credit hours per term and will be reduced by the amount of state and federal aid. 



2024-25 Applications by Tribe









Cost Control Measures

2024-25 academic year has over 746 valid applications – a record high

Awards to graduate-level students would be the first cost control lever to implement, which has an estimated cost of \$\$\$.

Currently, the application is still open for 2024-25. HECC may need to close the application and prioritize those who have already submitted for the year. This would impact students who have not yet applied or only plan to attend Winter and/or Spring Term.

If eliminating graduate awards and closing the application is not sufficient for budget, then reducing awards for current students would be the next step.

The Legislature approved \$24 million for the current biennium, with the understanding that HECC engage with the legislature if additional funds are required.

The 2025-27 GRB is \$28.5 million, an increase of \$2.5m over CSL.
