THREE CANNABIS BILLS for 2025

1. Business Modernization includes b2b and samples. LC 843
2. Regulatory Modernization includes federal LC 844
definition alignment, state business equity, and metric reforms.
3. OLCC Commission Seat LC 842

BUSINESS MODERNIZATION

- Allow for samples to be distributed at OLCC registered B2B events between.
- Allow for wholesale transactions to be made at OLCC registered B2B events.
- Allow for the transfer of flower between producers.
- Allow farms to distribute up to 4 immature plant samples to employees.
- Setting a minimum for samples distributed to employees.

1 gram of flower, 1 gram of extracts, 1 per sku of packaged goods



REFORM MODERNIZATION

- Align Oregon's definition of cannabis and hemp with the federal definition.
- Require all state agencies to work with cannabis businesses.
- Allow for digital manifests.
- Allow for manifest edits.
- Allow deliveries to be divided mid-route to different vehicles.
- Remove the 24hr lead time for orders to dispensaries.
- Allow the use of an auditable system for tracking plants on premise in lieu of plant tags.
- Increase the time to reconcile inventory to 5 days.
- Increase the length of a circular manifest to 5 days and remove the limit.



OLCC COMMISSIONER SEAT

- Mandate one OLCC Commission seat must be held by a cannabis licensee.
