





### **RESTAREA OPERATIONS FUNDING**



#### **OPERATING EXPENSES**



 Over the past eight years, TIC has received \$9.16 million annually from the State Highway Fund (ORS 377.841) to operate and maintain roadside rest areas.

• Costs for supplies, materials, and staff compensation have increased.

- In response, TIC has:
  - Streamlined operations;
  - Adjusted staffing model; and
  - Leveraged interest income to support operational costs.
- Rest area operations need increases to \$13.1 M annually next biennium.

### FUNDING REST AREA IMPROVEMENTS

- ORS 377.841 allocated \$19.5 million to TIC for capital improvements from 2018 to 2026.
- Current funding ends in July 2026 and is insufficient to cover:
  - Ongoing maintenance needs
  - $\circ\,$  Compliance with ADA standards
  - Any new safety enhancements
