I didn't see IBR post on Nextdoor.com about the DSEIS public comment period at all, and the information today did not show it as one of the social media selected by IBR to notify the public about the comment period. This is a major omission, since Nextdoor focuses on traffic issues and ODOT, WADOT, and CTRAN regularly posts on this site related to traffic concerns, and bus service. I also did not see any ODOT, WADOT or CTRAN posts about comment period either when checking their post history. Failing to use this outreach, that is known to and utilized by these agencies is a significant omission.

I Called 360-859-0494 for IBR information, heard a message that comments on voicemail need to be in BEFORE Nov. 18. This is incorrect and could have kept people from commenting.
