Public Hearing

HB 3274 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Southern Oregon University, subject to appropriation of sufficient moneys, to address state's behavioral and mental health needs by materially increasing number of mental health practitioners who graduate in southern Oregon and teaching behavioral and mental health competencies through alternative academic pathways.

HB 3090

Prohibits distributing, selling, attempting to sell or allowing to be sold flavored inhalant delivery system product or flavored tobacco product in this state.

Work Session

HB 2445

Authorizes independent behavioral health certification entity that meets specified requirements to certify addiction peer support specialists to work with coordinated care organizations.

HB 2543 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Oregon Health Authority to conduct study every four years of funding needed by community mental health programs in complying with statutory requirements and post report of findings to authority's website.

HB 2235

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study access to behavioral health treatment in rural and medically underserved areas of this state.

HB 2463

Requires Oregon Health Authority to convene two work groups to study statutory and regulatory framework for behavioral health systems and make recommendations to reduce administrative burdens on behavioral health care providers and increase system efficiencies.

HB 2541

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study current and future need for secure residential treatment facility beds and report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to

health, by September 15, 2023, findings of study and plan for statewide coordination of admissions to, discharges from and waiting lists for facilities and for achieving needed capacity.

HB 2544 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Health Authority for costs related to increasing statewide capacity of licensed residential facilities serving individuals with substance use disorders or mental health concerns.

HB 3425
Directs Oregon State Board of Nursing to issue license to practice as certified registered nurse anesthetist to qualified applicant.

HB 2539 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Trillium Family Services for construction of facility for Oregon Center for Child, Family and Community Health.

HB 3008
Limits ability of carriers offering dental benefit to require reimbursement of claims by credit card or electronic funds transfer.

HB 2979 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish program to issue grants to community colleges to promote and increase dental assistant and dental hygienist training programs in Oregon.

HB 3126 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Emergency Behavioral Health Services for Children program in Oregon Health Authority to promote timely delivery of behavioral health services to children who present to hospital emergency departments in behavioral health crises.

HB 2455
Imposes requirements and restrictions on insurer and coordinated care organization audits of claims for reimbursement submitted by behavioral health treatment providers.

HB 3157 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Health Insurance Mandate Review Advisory Committee to review each proposed legislative measure, legislative concept or amendment that requires health insurer or health care service contractor to reimburse cost of specified procedure or provider, if measure, concept or amendment is posted to legislative committee's agenda, and to produce report on equity and financial effects of each required coverage that is proposed and efficacy of treatment or service proposed.
