HB 3320

Imposes new requirements on hospitals with respect to financial assistance policies and processes.

HB 2499

Modifies membership requirements and duties of Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee and Health Evidence Review Commission and advisory committees appointed for committee and commission.

HB 2878 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Aligning for Health Pilot Program, administered by Oregon Health Authority, to test alternative methods for payment for health care.

HB 2397

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study opioid overdose prevention.

HB 3300

Authorizes Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists to issue limited permit to qualified applicant.

HB 2725

Prohibits pharmacy benefit manager from imposing fees on rural pharmacies after point of sale.

HB 3012

HB 2555 **

Requires individual and group health benefit plans and benefit plans offered by Public

Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to reimburse services provided by naturopathic physicians within scope of their practice if services are reimbursed when provided by licensed physicians.

HB 3140

Removes requirement that Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board solicit new bids for actuarial or technical support every three years.

HB 2817

Clarifies area of leg to which definition of "podiatry" applies.
