HB 3320

Imposes new requirements on hospitals with respect to financial assistance policies and processes.

HB 2878 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Aligning for Health Pilot Program, administered by Oregon Health Authority, to test alternative methods for payment for health care.

HB 2397

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study opioid overdose prevention.

HB 2725

Prohibits pharmacy benefit manager from imposing fees on rural pharmacies after point of sale. HB 3012

Requires pharmacy benefit managers to annually report specified information to Department of Consumer and Business Services, including costs and rebates of prescription drugs for enrollees. HB 3013 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Requires pharmacy benefit managers to be licensed by Department of Consumer and Business Services beginning January 1, 2024, and imposes new requirements on pharmacy benefit managers.

- HB 2927 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Establishes Statewide Steering Committee on Sickle Cell Disease.
- HB 2665 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Directs Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules to establish rates that temporary staffing agency may charge to or receive from entity that engages temporary staffing agency.

HB 2555 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Requires individual and group health benefit plans and benefit plans offered by Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to reimburse services provided

3140 HB

Removes requirement that Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board solicit new bids for actuarial or technical support every three years.

HB 2817

Clarifies area of leg to which definition of "podiatry" applies.

HB 2235

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-21-2023 MEETING: Requires Oregon Health Authority to study access to behavioral health treatment in rural and medically underserved areas of this state.

HB 2979 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-21-2023 MEETING: Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish program to issue grants to community colleges to promote and increase dental assistant and dental hygienist training programs in Oregon.

HB 3008

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-21-2023 MEETING: Limits ability of carriers offering dental benefit to require reimbursement of claims by credit card or electronic funds transfer.

HB 3126 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-21-2023 MEETING: Establishes Emergency Behavioral Health Services for Children program in Oregon Health Authority to promote timely delivery of behavioral health services to children who present to hospital emergency departments in behavioral health crises.

HB 2463

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-21-2023 MEETING: Requires Oregon Health Authority to convene two work groups to study statutory and regulatory framework for behavioral health systems and make recommendations to reduce administrative burdens on behavioral health care providers and increase system efficiencies.
