Public Hearing

HB 3380

Allows physician to prescribe continuous glucose monitor to certain patients whether or not physician specializes in endocrinology.

HB 3298 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Health Authority to disburse to Oregon Health and Science University funds to support entity established within Oregon Health and Science University that advocates for improved maternal and neonatal outcomes.

HB 3258

Requires monitoring and reporting by prescription drug program prescription and dispensation of prescription drugs classified in schedule V of federal Controlled Substances Act.

HB 2642

Requires practitioner to query electronic prescription monitoring system with respect to patient prior to issuing to, or renewing for, patient prescription for certain prescription drugs.

HB 3324 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Health Authority to establish program to provide incentives to nurse instructors.

HB 3596

Allows person to practice surgical technology at health care facility if person has completed and is certified by specified apprenticeship program.

HB 2421

Allows applied behavior analysis professional to provide outpatient treatment for mental or emotional disorder or chemical dependency to certain patients without parental consent.

HB 2499

Modifies membership requirements and duties of Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee and Health Evidence Review Commission and advisory committees appointed for committee and commission.

HB 3300

Authorizes Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists to issue limited permit to qualified applicant.

HB 2552 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures
Increases amount of income tax credit allowed to rural medical providers.

HB 2602 **

Adds nursing assistant or nurse to types of providers who are eligible for income tax credit allowed to rural medical providers.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures and the substitution of the substitutio

HB 2626 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures

Adds licensed mental health professionals and certified medical laboratory scientists and medical
laboratory technicians to types of providers eligible for tax credit allowed to rural medical care
provider.

HB 2723 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures

Modifies conditions of eligibility for tax credit allowed to rural medical care provider.

HB 2420

Directs Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules allowing county registrar to issue and sell records of live births and deaths occurring in any county of state.

HB 2002 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Modifies provisions relating to reproductive health rights.

HB 3040

Requires coordinated care organizations to share claims and encounter data with provider regarding patients that provider contracts with coordinated care organization to serve.

HB 2538 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Requires health insurance coverage of health care interpretation services that are legally mandated.

HB 2445

Authorizes independent behavioral health certification entity that meets specified requirements to certify addiction peer support specialists to work with coordinated care organizations.

HB 2539 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for
distribution to Trillium Family Services for construction of facility for Oregon Center for
Child, Family and Community Health.

HB 2455

Imposes requirements and restrictions on insurer and coordinated care organization audits of claims for reimbursement submitted by behavioral health treatment providers.

HB 3157 **

Establishes Health Insurance Mandate Review Advisory Committee to review each proposed legislative measure, legislative concept or amendment that requires health insurer or health care service contractor to reimburse cost of specified procedure or provider, if measure, concept or amendment is posted to legislative committee's agenda, and to produce report on equity and financial effects of each required coverage that is proposed and efficacy of treatment or service proposed.

HB 2725

Prohibits pharmacy benefit manager from imposing fees on rural pharmacies after point of sale.

HB 3012

Requires pharmacy benefit managers to annually report specified information to Department of Consumer and Business Services, including costs and rebates of prescription drugs for enrollees.

HB 3013 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires pharmacy benefit managers to be licensed by Department of Consumer and Business Services beginning January 1, 2024, and imposes new requirements on pharmacy benefit managers.

HB 2665 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules to establish rates that temporary staffing agency may charge to or receive from entity that engages temporary staffing agency.
