Public Hearing

SB217 A

Requires that cosmetology curriculum taught by school meet standards established by Board of Cosmetology and be approved by Health Licensing Office.

SB 303 A

Requires psilocybin service center to collect and aggregate specified data and submit aggregated data to Oregon Health Authority.

SB 1043 A

Requires hospitals and other specified facilities that provide substance use disorder treatment to provide to specified patients upon discharge or release two doses of opioid overdose reversal medication and necessary medical supplies to administer medication.

SB 965 A

Allows Oregon Health Authority to conduct off-site investigation after receiving certain complaints against hospitals.

Work Session

SB 226

Removes requirement that Oregon State Board of Nursing notify State Board of Pharmacy upon authorizing nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist to dispense prescription drugs.

SB 227

During emergency declared by Governor, allows Oregon State Board of Nursing to issue limited license to practice nursing to nurse licensed in another jurisdiction and to issue limited certificate as nursing assistant to nursing assistant authorized to practice in another jurisdiction.

SB 969

Removes requirement that Oregon State Board of Nursing certify as nursing assistant any qualified applicant.

SB 703

Requires passage of specified examination for certification as nursing assistant.

SB 189 A

Allows health care facility to transfer human pathological waste, which includes biopsy materials, human tissues and anatomical parts that emanate from surgeries, autopsies and obstetrical and laboratory procedures on humans, to donor of pathological waste or authorized representative of donor if waste is intended for cremation, interment or other final disposition.
