Work Session

HB 3459

Prohibits energy utility from disconnecting service to residential customer for failure to pay amount owed for energy services.

HB 3590 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs College of Forestry at Oregon State University, in collaboration with Department of Environmental Quality and State Forestry Department, to research development of fuel pathways for low carbon fuels derived from woody biomass residues from forestry operations.

HB 3004

Requires State Department of Energy to study renewable energy resource development.

HB 3464

Provides, for purposes of certain statutes relating to taking of predatory animals, that terms "predatory animal" and "rodent" do not include beavers.

HB 3055

Requires Public Utility Commission to establish eligibility cap for nameplate capacity for small power production facility that produces energy using solar or wind energy to qualify as qualifying facility at no less than 10 megawatts.

HB 2571 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to establish program for providing rebates to qualifying individuals who purchase electric assisted bicycles or cargo electric bicycles and qualifying equipment.

Public Hearing

HB 3378

Requires Public Utility Commission, in consultation with State Department of Energy, to study development and adoption of microgrid systems and use of microgrid systems for increasing electric grid and energy resilience.

HB 3525

Requires power purchase agreements to permit qualifying facilities to provide energy or energy and capacity to third parties during periods of emergency.

HB 3579

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to adopt rules to govern procurements of clean energy technology.
