Work Session

HB 3378

Requires Public Utility Commission, in consultation with State Department of Energy, to study development and adoption of microgrid systems and use of microgrid systems for increasing electric grid and energy resilience.

HB 3579

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to adopt rules to govern procurements of clean energy technology.

HB 2714 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to establish program to provide rebates to persons that purchase qualifying medium or heavy duty zero-emission vehicles.

HB 3152

Permits Public Utility Commission to institute one or more proceedings to ensure commission's regulations, rules and orders, and programs overseen by commission, align with greenhouse gas emissions reduction requirements and targets established by statute or executive order, do not impede or delay timely and equitable implementation of greenhouse gas emissions reduction requirements and targets, and mitigate energy burden and risks of stranded assets for residential utility customers.

HB 2614 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires transportation network companies to meet or exceed specified targets for percentage of service miles provided by zero-emission vehicles.

HB 2816

Requires person who owns, operates or controls high energy use facility to ensure that greenhouse gas emissions associated with electricity used by high energy use facility are reduced to 60 percent below baseline emissions levels by 2027, 80 percent below baseline emissions levels by 2030, 90 percent below baseline emissions levels by 2035 and 100 percent below baseline emissions levels by 2040.

AGENDA (cont.) April 3, 2023

HB 3143

Authorizes public utility, upon approval by Public Utility Commission, to issue bonds and securitize debt for costs and expenses incurred or to be incurred by public utility associated with events subject to federal or state declaration of emergency.

HB 3464

Provides, for purposes of certain statutes relating to taking of predatory animals, that terms "predatory animal" and "rodent" do not include beavers.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2170

Requires State Department of Energy to study feasibility of establishing renewable hydrogen hub at Oregon International Port of Coos Bay.
