Public Hearing

HB 2892

Authorizes granting agency to prequalify nonprofit organization to receive block grants for purpose of providing goods and services in areas of critical need.

HB 2178

Requires state agencies to include, as part of agency request budget, analysis of extent to which goods and services can be acquired from work programs operated by Department of Corrections or Oregon Corrections Enterprises.

HB 3260

Authorizes self-service dispensing of Class 1 flammable liquids at retail dispensary in rural Oregon.

HB 2914 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Task Force on Abandoned and Derelict Vessels.

HB 2865

Specifies leave of absence entitled for public employee for initial active duty for training and annual active duty training as member of National Guard, National Guard Reserve or reserve component of Armed Forces of the United States or of United States Public Health Service is for days that are work days.

HB 2948 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Department of Emergency Management to develop and implement program to award grants for fairgrounds used as emergency evacuation sites.

HB 2144

Requires Oregon Military Department to study veterans.

HB 2650

Establishes requirements for informal workgroups and task forces.

HB 3426

Requires 9-8-8 crisis hotline centers to have policies and train staff on serving firefighters and other first responders.

HB 3484 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes State Fire Marshal Firefighting Costs Fund.

HB 3485

Provides State Fire Marshal with certain additional discretionary powers.

HB 2522

Requires governing body of county that contains at-risk land, as defined, to develop, or solicit proposals for development of, fire response plan or wildfire response plan.

HB 2875

Excludes hours of overtime worked for Oregon State Police from limitations on inclusion of overtime in final average salary for purposes of Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan.
