#### Public Hearing

- HB 2308 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Requires that each district attorney in state be paid same salary.
- HB 2391 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Appropriates moneys for 2023-2025 biennium to Oregon Department of Administrative Services to fund county victim assistance programs.
- HB 3571  
Establishes immunity from prosecution for theft in first degree and civil liability for nonprofit animal rescue entity that takes possession of, keeps and disposes of cat or dog as provided in Act.
- SB 581 A  
Modifies applicability of earned reduction of supervision changes in House Bill 2172 (2021).

#### Work Session

- HB 2128  
Replaces escrow deposit system required of tobacco product manufacturers who are nonparticipating manufacturers for purposes of Master Settlement Agreement with requirement of direct payments to state.
- HB 2509  
Provides that residuary clause in will or trust that conveys all property of decedent is sufficient to transfer recorded brand.
- HB 2593  
Reduces penalties for crime of offensive littering in certain circumstances.
- HB 2594  
Modifies penalties for throwing lighted material onto certain property.
- HB 3275  
Provides that supervision of certain misdemeanor offenders reverts to Department of Corrections if county opts out of providing correctional services.

SB 310

Increases amount of civil penalty Attorney General may obtain for violation of antitrust statutes from \$250,000 to \$1 million.

SB 311

Modifies damages and penalties awarded for action for false claims.
