HB 2005

Defines "undetectable firearm." Punishes manufacturing, importing, offering for sale or transferring undetectable firearm by maximum of 10 years' imprisonment, \$250,000 fine, or both.

HB 2391 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys for 2023-2025 biennium to Oregon Department of Administrative Services to fund county victim assistance programs.

HB 2519

Prohibits acceptance of consideration for displaying human remains to public.

HB 2919

Provides that registered nurse providing patient care in good faith is immune from criminal liability for act or omission that is part of provision of care unless offense has intentional or knowing culpable mental state.

HB 3294

Requires county clerk to replace recorded instrument with court-ordered version that redacts discriminatory language.

SB 305

Modifies provisions relating to special motions to strike.

Public Hearing

HB 2890 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Corrections Ombudsman to support Department of Corrections' continuous quality improvement efforts, and to provide report to Governor and committees or interim committees of Legislative Assembly detailing staffing and resources needed to fulfill powers and duties of office within six months of appointment of ombudsman.

HB 3392

Allows removing authority to publish notice of intent to dispose of unclaimed property via publicly viewable electronic method as alternative to newspaper.

HB 3513

Authorizes federal firearms licensee or other person to enter into firearm hold agreement with firearm owner.

HB 3581 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Authorizes State Treasurer to issue Article XI-Q general obligation bonds to finance expansion of courthouses.
