Work Session

HB 2323

Provides that culpable mental state applies to each material conduct element unless statutory language or legislative intent plainly indicates otherwise.

HB 2497 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs State Court Administrator to fund assessment of courthouses in small counties.

HB 3213

Prohibits manufacturer from selling or offering to sell cosmetic developed through use of cosmetic animal test.

HB 3581 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Authorizes State Treasurer to issue Article XI-Q general obligation bonds to finance expansion of courthouses.

HB 3582

Establishes procedure for charging aggravated version of certain assault and attempted murder offenses when defendant causes permanent physical injury to victim during commission of crime.

SB 306 A

Modifies statutes to allow for nonattorney associate members of the Oregon State Bar to practice law in certain scope of practice.

SB 317

Provides that requirement that certain hearsay statements of unavailable witnesses concerning acts of abuse must be supported by corroborative evidence applies in juvenile delinquency proceedings.

SB 529

Modifies legislative findings concerning alternative incarceration programs.

Public Hearing

HB 3214

Prohibits person from using specified types of animals in traveling animal act.

HB 3377

Provides that exception for person participating in diversion to use prescription and nonprescription drugs applies only to those drugs that are approved by United States Food and Drug Administration.

HB 3390

Prohibits sale, offer for sale or trade of fur product in State of Oregon.
