- HB 2306 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of State Police for biennium beginning July 1, 2023, to increase capability of department's forensic laboratories to conduct analyses of blood for controlled substances.
- HB 2345
Directs Department of Corrections to study programs available to adults in custody, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- HB 2467 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Public Defense Services Student Loan Repayment Assistance Program in Oregon State Bar to provide forgivable loans to eligible public defense attorneys for outstanding student loans.
- HB 2473
Directs court clerk to provide, upon request, certified copy of any record available on electronic records management system of Judicial Department.
- HB 2672 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Public Law School Tuition Forgiveness program.
- HB 2772 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates crime of domestic terrorism.
- HB 2890 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Corrections Ombudsman to support Department of Corrections' continuous quality improvement efforts, and to provide report to Governor and committees or interim committees of Legislative Assembly detailing staffing and resources needed to fulfill powers and duties of office within six months of appointment of ombudsman.
- HB 3035 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates crime of threatening a mass injury event.

HB 3214

Prohibits person from using specified types of animals in traveling animal act.

HB 3377

Provides that exception for person participating in diversion to use prescription and nonprescription drugs applies only to those drugs that are approved by United States Food and Drug Administration.

HB 3384

Creates crime of aggravated animal neglect in the first degree.

HB 3390

Prohibits sale, offer for sale or trade of fur product in State of Oregon.

HB 3392

Allows removing authority to publish notice of intent to dispose of unclaimed property via publicly viewable electronic method as alternative to newspaper.

HB 3513

Authorizes federal firearms licensee or other person to enter into firearm hold agreement with firearm owner.
