Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- SB 1082 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish project connecting adults in custody and former adults in custody to community colleges, public universities and apprenticeship programs.
- SB 269
Directs Department of Corrections and Higher Education Coordinating Commission to enter into memorandum of understanding regarding correctional education system.
- SB 270
Authorizes adult in custody to enroll in academic program at any community college in state, any distance learning academic program or any other higher education academic program that adult in custody applies for and is accepted into, provided that enrollment in academic program is consistent with administrative rules and regulations adopted by Department of Corrections.
- SB 517
Prohibits licensing board, commission or agency from denying, suspending or revoking occupational or professional license solely for reason that applicant or licensee was convicted of crime or subject to qualifying juvenile adjudication that does not substantially relate to specific duties and responsibilities for which license is required.
- SB 17
Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission, in coordination with Department of Public Safety Standards and Training and community colleges, to study how best to make classes that are part of recruit academy training for police officers be academic credits that are part of associate degree.
- SB 658 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes pilot program to provide funding to school districts for purposes of increasing access to schools by homeless students and improving academic achievement of homeless students.
- SB 449
Permits adopted former foster children to have amount of tuition and all fees waived if attending defined institutions of higher education for purposes of pursuing initial undergraduate degree.

- SB 215 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/23/2023 MEETING: Allows Department of Education to adjust amounts charged related to distribution of agricultural products received from United States Department of Agriculture for school food programs.
- SB 290
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/23/2023 MEETING: Clarifies education duties of State Board of Education, Department of Education, Superintendent of Public Instruction and district school boards.
- SB 426 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/23/2023 MEETING: Modifies requirements of Healthy and Safe Schools Plan related to integrated pest management.
- SB 489
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/23/2023 MEETING: Eliminates restrictions on payment of unemployment insurance benefits to certain nonprofessional educational workers.
- SB 518
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/23/2023 MEETING: Specifies contract price at which apprentice utilization requirements apply to qualified contracts with institutions of higher education and school districts.
- SB 523
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/23/2023 MEETING: Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission plan regarding applied baccalaureate degrees to include name and type of applied baccalaureate degrees to be conferred.
- SB 549 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/23/2023 MEETING: Directs Oregon Health Authority to modify amounts of grants for school-based health centers for inflation.
- SB 283
Requires Department of Education to conduct study to determine how to address workforce shortage in education.
- SB 551
Requires school districts to provide specified information related to secure storage of medications and firearms.
- SB 600 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for distribution to Oregon Office for Community Dispute Resolution at University of Oregon.
- SB 218
Requires Department of Education and law enforcement agencies to make available to Teacher Standards and Practices Commission certain information received during investigation of suspected sexual conduct or child abuse.
- SB 575 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Education to develop and implement statewide education plan for students who are eligible for special education and who have experienced disproportionate results in education due to historical practices.
- SB 923
Requires school districts to designate person's school or program of enrollment.

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SB 758

Prescribes timelines and redacting requirements for records related to provision of special education.

SB 572 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to work with Portland State University and community colleges to establish post-secondary program for youth with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

SB 992

Prescribes requirements for information recorded on student transcript, including types of credits earned by student.
