HB 2235 A

Requires Oregon Health Authority to convene work group to study major barriers to workforce recruitment and retention in publicly financed behavioral health system in this state and to develop recommendations on specified topics.

HB 2278

Authorizes pharmacists to administer influenza vaccine to persons six months of age or older.

HB 2395 A

Allows specified persons to distribute and administer short-acting opioid antagonist and distribute kits.

HB 2421 A

Directs Health Licensing Office to establish guidelines for professional methods and procedures used by registered behavior analysis interventionists.

HB 2446

Requires extension to no later than December 31, 2026, of term for contract between Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organization.

HB 2486

Allows certain pharmacy technicians to administer vaccines.

HB 2513 A

Requires local planning committees for alcohol and drug prevention and treatment services to coordinate with local Behavioral Health Resource Networks.

HB 2535 A

Requires Department of Corrections to establish doula program for pregnant and postpartum adults in custody at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility.

HB 2584 A

Specifies physician assistant scope of practice and duties of care when practicing medicine.

HB 2600

Requires Governor, in appointing members to Oregon State Board of Nursing, to balance diversity of setting in which nurse or certified nursing assistant members provide care.

HB 2627 A

Removes one member who has degree of Doctor of Medicine and adds one member who is physician assistant to membership of Oregon Medical Board.

HB 2817 A

Clarifies area of leg to which definition of "podiatry" applies.

HB 3320 A

Imposes new requirements on hospitals with respect to financial assistance policies and processes.

HB 3425

Directs Oregon State Board of Nursing to issue license to practice as certified registered nurse anesthetist to qualified applicant.

HB 3596 A

Allows person to practice surgical technology at health care facility if person has completed and is certified by specified apprenticeship program.
