SB 99

Requires Department of Human Services to study department's processes for delivering services to aging adults.

SB 823

Requires disclosure, in response to public records request, of reports of investigations of child abuse occurring at specified state-authorized programs.

SB 1000 ** *Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Adds new entity eligible to receive grant funds to provide services to refugees and adds new categories of refugees eligible for assistance.

SB 694 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires membership of task forces and work groups to be comprised at least 50 percent of community members and individuals who are members of or who represent community-based organizations.

SB 92

Requires Department of Human Services to study potential strategies to ensure that recipients of public benefits who are eligible to serve on boards or commissions can be compensated for their service without losing eligibility for benefits.

SB 1016 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Human Services to establish and maintain regional family support networks for families of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

SB 792

Requires Department of Human Services to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health, no later than September 15, 2024, on implementation of agency with choice.

SB 820

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide community-based services and supports to individuals with complex mental or behavioral health needs who are under 21 years of age.
