Public Hearing

SB 321

Creates process by which person convicted or found guilty except for insanity as result of nonunanimous jury verdict may file petition for post-conviction relief within one year of effective date of Act.

SB 1065

Establishes procedure for person with qualifying conviction for possession of controlled substance to file motion requesting court order setting aside conviction.

Establishes Task Force on Organized Retail Theft.

Work Session

SB 318

Directs Department of Justice to study ways to address organized retail theft, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2023.

SB 340

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study recidivism rates of persons convicted of felony property crimes, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.

SB 536

Establishes best interest standard for recommendations or sales of annuities to prospective purchasers.

SB 615

Modifies crime of organizing speed racing event.

SB 808

Modifies membership and other provisions relating to the Commission on Statewide Law Enforcement Standards of Conduct and Discipline.

March 21, 2023

SB 862

Permits owner of self-service storage facility to advertise or publish notice of sale of personal property that is subject to lien once in newspaper of general circulation or on publicly accessible website that regularly advertises or offers personal property for auction or sale.

SB 910

Excludes certain on-street and off-street parking pay stations from requirement to accept coins and currency as payment for goods and services.
