SB 355

Requires Oregon State Bar to study attorneys.

SB 380

Requires Judicial Department to study protective proceedings.

For the purpose of consideration of the -1 amendments only.

SB 909

Updates and modernizes laws that govern formation, governance, operations and conversion of limited liability companies in this state and relations among members, managers and third parties with respect to limited liability companies in this state.

SB 1027

Modifies hearing process before State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision for persons convicted of murder or aggravated murder who are sentenced to life imprisonment with possibility of parole, work release or release to post-prison supervision.

SB 188

Repeals provision prohibiting court from excluding admissible evidence on grounds evidence was obtained in violation of statute except in specified circumstances.

SB 326

Requires owner of real property where site of unlawful manufacture of marijuana or unlawful production of marijuana is located to clean up waste from site upon receipt of notification from law enforcement agency.

SB 343

Directs Department of Transportation to study issues related to driving privileges and to report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2024.

SB 519

Modifies procedure for expunction of certain juvenile records.

SB 763

Increases penalties for possession of certain amounts of fentanyl.
