Public Hearing

SB 337

Directs Public Defense Services Commission to study ways to improve provision of public defense services within this state, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.

SB 957

Expands types of prior convictions that increase offense level for crime of public indecency.

Work Session

SB 188

Repeals provision prohibiting court from excluding admissible evidence on grounds evidence was obtained in violation of statute except in specified circumstances.

SB 256

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Prohibits person from knowingly or intentionally manufacturing, importing, distributing, offering for sale, selling or leasing or otherwise transferring, or installing or reinstalling counterfeit automobile supplemental restraint system component, nonfunctional airbag or object that does not comply with federal standard for make, model and year of motor vehicle.

SB 344

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study use of technology to improve accuracy when measuring recidivism rates of persons convicted of felonies, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.

SB 348

Directs Department of Justice to study ways to address unlawful possession of firearms, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.

SB 355

Requires Oregon State Bar to study attorneys.

SB 376

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study insurance.

SB 380

Requires Judicial Department to study protective proceedings.

SB 527

Allows gun dealer or person transferring firearms, firearm accessories, ammunition or ammunition components for purchase at gun show, or business engaged in repairing or servicing firearms to establish minimum age of 21 years for such purchases, repairs or services. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

SB 528 **

Modifies provisions relating to protective proceedings.

SB 614

Establishes exception, for video cameras worn by law enforcement officer, to prohibition on law enforcement agency collecting or maintaining information about person's political, religious or social views or activities.

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Permits consumers to obtain from a controller that processes consumer personal data confirmation as to whether controller is processing consumer's personal data and categories of personal data controller is processing, list of specific third parties to which controller has disclosed consumer's personal data and copy of all of consumer's personal data that controller has processed or is processing.

SB 697

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Modifies process for setting aside convictions and guilty except for insanity judgments.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Directs Judicial Department to develop and implement automated system that identifies convictions, arrests, citations, charges and judgments of guilty except for insanity that are eligible to be automatically sealed.

SB 808

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Modifies membership and other provisions relating to the Commission on Statewide Law Enforcement Standards of Conduct and Discipline.

SB 848

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Extends provision relating to indemnification provisions in construction agreements to all types of damages.

SB 891

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Modifies provisions relating to Oregon Death with Dignity Act.

SB 953

Changes title of "district medical examiner" to "county medical examiner." Changes title of "medical-legal death investigator" to "medicolegal death investigator."

Eliminates partial reimbursement by state of certain county autopsy expenditures.

SB 974

Creates crime of sexual assault by fraudulent representation.

SB 1052

Modifies crimes related to involuntary servitude and human trafficking.

SB 1060

Modifies definition of "physical injury," for purposes of Oregon Criminal Code, to include physical trauma.

SB 1061

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-29-2023 MEETING: Directs Oregon Cannabis Commission, Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission and Department of Revenue to work collaboratively to ensure access to cannabis for Oregonians.
