CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2023 MEETING: Provides employee with right to refuse to perform task assigned by employer under certain circumstances.

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2023 MEETING: Directs Department of Transportation to establish small business assistance program to assist qualified small businesses in competing for department's public improvement contracts.

SB 631

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2023 MEETING: Permits employees of certain state agencies to refuse to work additional mandatory overtime shift scheduled by employer when employee has already worked mandatory overtime in same month.

SB 999

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/30/2023 MEETING: Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues relating to different leave laws under which individuals may take time off of work for qualifying reasons.

SB 30

Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries, in consultation with Employment Department to conduct study that identifies apprenticeship opportunities in this state and evaluates best practices for keeping up-to-date list of available opportunities on webpages of bureau and department.

SB 32

Permits Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study public contracting law.

SB 33

Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues related to internal staffing at bureau.

SB 34

Authorizes Oregon Business Development Department to survey state loan and grant programs for economic development.

SB 35

Permits Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues relating to employment in this state.

SB 36

Authorizes Director of Employment Department to study alternative arrangements by which employers may make tax payments required under unemployment insurance law.

SB 37

Permits Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues relating to unlawful employment practices that occur in Oregon.

SB 52

Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues related to compliance with employment laws of this state.

SB 591
