SUMMARY

Establishes Task Force on Lobby Ethics. Directs task force to study and make recommendations to improve and standardize lobby ethics and to improve transparency on how money and lobbying impact decision making within legislative process.

Sunsets task force on December 31, 2024.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

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- 2 Relating to lobbying; and prescribing an effective date.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Lobby Ethics is established.
- 5 (2) The task force consists of 11 members appointed as follows:
- 6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint:

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- 7 (A) Two members from among members of the Senate.
- 8 (B) Two members who are registered lobbyists under ORS 171.740.
- 9 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:
- 10 (A) Two members from among members of the House of Represen-11 tatives.
 - (B) Two members who are registered lobbyists under ORS 171.740.
- 13 (c) The Governor shall appoint one member of the Oregon Govern-14 ment Ethics Commission, one representative of local governments and 15 one registered lobbyist under ORS 171.740.
 - (3) The task force shall study lobbying in this state and make recommendations to improve and standardize lobby ethics and to improve transparency on how money and lobbying impact decision making

- 1 within the legislative process.
- 2 (4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes 3 a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 4 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a ma-5 jority of the voting members of the task force.
- 6 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chair-7 person.
- 8 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority 9 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
- 10 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the 11 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the 12 task force.
- 13 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- 15 (10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided 16 by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to 17 the interim Senate and House committees on rules no later than Sep-18 tember 15, 2024.
- 19 (11) The Legislative Policy and Research Director shall provide staff 20 support to the task force.
- 21 (12) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task 22 force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an ad-23 visory capacity only.
- 24 (13) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legis-25 lative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement 26 for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.
- (14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
