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
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

Enrollment (number of students) by Grade Level



English Learners and Students with IEPs, as a Percent of All Enrolled Students (Spring)



Homeschooling

• There were substantial increases in the number of students who are homeschooled in Oregon

Virtual Schools


- Some Oregon districts experienced enrollment increases in 2020-21, largely connected to the operation of virtual schools, both existing and newly created
- With enrollment trends stabilizing, many of these enrollment increases were short-lived

Homeschooling Changes

- Available data suggest that substantial increases in homeschooling occurred in Oregon between 2019-20 and 2020-21 (more than 70% increase)
- Not all ESDs provided data to the department, but this represents ~13,000 additional students registered in 2020-21
- In some regions of the state, homeschoolers more than doubled
- Reported increases in homeschooling accounts for approximately 60% of the total decline in public K-12 enrollment in 2020-21

Virtual Enrollment Changes

Virtual programs are expanding in Oregon, due largely to expansion of district virtual schools
