



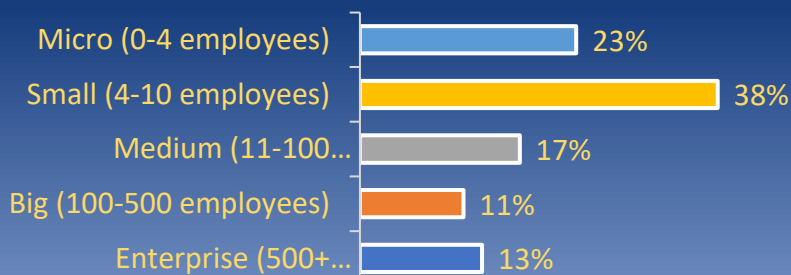
Oregon Supplier Ecosystem

Supporting small businesses in Oregon

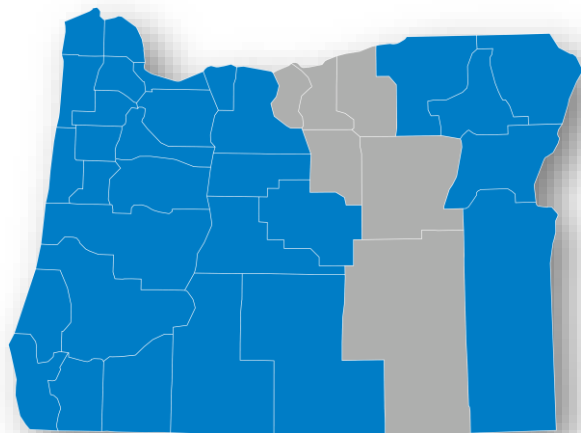


We support the growth and development of small businesses and more than 50% of the suppliers in state are micro or small business.

Intel Oregon has over 22,000 employees, a vast network of local contractors and suppliers, and significant capital investments, Intel's annual impact extends far beyond our own workforce. In fact, our total annual impact includes over **105,000 jobs**, more than \$10 billion in labor income, and a contribution of over **\$19 billion** to the gross domestic product. Since 2019, we have invested over \$3 billion in the construction of our latest expansion, Mod3, which has provided employment for more than 3,000 electricians, pipe fitters, welders, and other skilled trade workers across Oregon.
