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HB 5024 (2021)

- \$130M
- Regional Development and Innovation
 - Planning Grants to Counties
 - Licensed Residential Treatment Homes or Facilities
 - Supportive Housing for Individuals Serious and Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI)
- Request for Grant Applications (RFGAs)
 - Rolling funding rounds from July through November 2022
 - Received 48 project applications, with a combined total of 425 proposed/potential new beds




HB 5024: Supportive Housing by County

- Projected units needed, before HB 5024 = 1,000
- Units added (through October 2022 funding round) = 94
 - Clatsop 43 units
 - Marion 12 units
 - Multnomah 29 units
 - Yamhill 10 units



HB 5024: Counties with Residential Projects Underway (Through October 2022)



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HB 5202 (2022)

- \$100M
- One-time funding for Community Mental Health Programs (CMHPs) for supported housing and residential treatment
 - Funding was allocated to counties according to their funding formula
- Broad discretion for CMHPs on how to use funds
 - Examples: Repurpose or build new facilities; plan or purchase land for new facilities; support services; short term shelter beds; long term rental assistance; immediate needs for houseless individuals (food, clothing)
 - Light administrative reporting requirements
 - First report with details on county projects and total number of beds due by end of 2022



How do CMHPs Plan to Use the \$100M?

• Based on initial project options outlined in CMHP proposals, it is estimated these funds will support the following:

Service/Facility Type	Beds/Units
Emergency or Temporary Shelter	93+
Supportive Housing (transitional and permanent)	498
Adult Foster Homes	10
Residential Treatment Homes (RTH)	16
Residential Treatment Facilities (RTF)	16
Secure Residential Treatment Facilities (SRTF)	29
Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Units	44

Projects are subject to change as CMHPs identify viable properties
