## **Questions & Answers For HB 2618**

Question: Does the Oregon Department of Education hire speech language pathologists (SLPs) directly?

## Response:

No - school districts, education service districts, and early intervention/early childhood special education programs directly hire or contract SLPs (and other medically-licensed personnel such as occupational therapists, physical therapists, nurses, licensed clinical social workers, etc.).

Question: Is it the Oregon Department of Education's responsibility to understand the caseload of their employees?

## Response:

As noted above, the Oregon Department of Education does not hire staff directly on behalf of school districts, education service districts, and early intervention/early childhood special education programs.





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The Oregon Department of Education is aware that there are workload and staffing issues throughout the state. As it relates to school health services, the Oregon Department of Education only collects staffing and student acuity data for school nursing as required by ORS 336.201. The Oregon Department of Education submits a school nurse report to the state legislature by October 1st of every year. The Oregon Department of Education does not have regulatory authority over medically-licensed staff practicing in school settings. The scope of practice for medically-licensed staff is set by their respective licensing boards. A licensee must practice in accordance with their licensing board rules regardless of the practice setting. A high caseload may impact their ability to adhere to the requirements of their licensing board.
